Clean Tahoe Program and Its Dedicated Crew

The County of Nevada Board of Supervisors takes great pleasure in recognizing the Clean Tahoe Program and its dedicated crew for their significant contributions to the Truckee and Tahoe community.

Starting in 1988, the Clean Tahoe Program was formed out of the necessity to address growing litter and illegal dumping throughout South Lake Tahoe. Two years after the City of South Lake Tahoe and the County of Eldorado formed a Joint Powers Agreement (JPA), Clean Tahoe became a separate legal public benefit corporation in 1994. Most recently in July 2021, Clean Tahoe expanded their operations to serve the East and North Shore of the Tahoe basin through litter abatement, trash management, and public education. In the last year Clean Tahoe has effectively implemented processes developed in South Lake to address trash problems in the greater Tahoe basin, including within the Truckee region.

In the last year Clean Tahoe crew, comprised of only a six (6) person team who works Monday through Friday, has cleaned 402 animals in trash messes, 238 illegal dumps, and picked up 1,053,621 pounds of litter off the roadway. The Clean Tahoe Crew has and continues to provide invaluable service to the Truckee and Tahoe region and stand as a testament to the values and commitment for a healthy community.
