SUBJECT: Resolution approving acceptance of additional Behavioral Health Bridge Housing funds and execution of Modification #1 to the subcontract agreement with Advocates for Human Potential, Inc. on behalf of the California Department of Health Care Services in the maximum amount of \$9,392,984 (an increase of \$2,791,170) for the contract term of June 23, 2023 through June 30, 2027 and directs the Auditor-Controller to amend the Behavioral Health Budget for fiscal year 2025/26 (4/5 Affirmative Vote Required).

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the attached Resolution.

FUNDING: This modification adds \$2,791,170 of funding from the California Department of Health Care Services for the Behavioral Health Bridge Housing (BHBH) Program (AB179) being administered through Advocates for Human Potential, Inc. (AHP) to address housing and treatment needs of people experiencing unsheltered homelessness. A budget amendment for the expenditure side was included as part of the subgrantee agreement with Hospitality House, brought to the June 2, 2026, board meeting. This Resolution is adding the revenue budget amendment piece. There are no county general fund dollars required.

BACKGROUND: On November 7, 2023, (RES. 23-559) this Board accepted an award of \$3.6 million in BHBH Round 1 funding and authorized NCBH to sign agreements with DHCS to implement the Behavioral Health Bridge Housing Program in Nevada County. NCBH contracted with Hospitality House Shelter to support in the implementation of the BHBH program.

On November 12, 2024, (RES. 24-591) this Board accepted an amendment adding an additional \$3,000,000 of BHBH Round 3 funding, which was utilized to rehabilitate an existing owned county building to add 7 BHBH program beds, as well as to partner with Hospitality House to bring online an additional 30 beds of interim housing through a modular home development on

land owned by Hospitality House. These additional units of housing received their certificate of occupancy in December 2025.

Since the program's launch in December 2023, BHBH has served 187 unique individuals, connecting 55 of those individuals to permanent housing.

In March of 2026, DHCS informed Nevada County that additional BHBH funding was available and requested that we work with Hospitality House to submit project concepts. The shelter developed a project to acquire two (2) single family homes to be rehabilitated into up to 20 additional housing beds for the BHBH Program. On April 30, 2026, the County received notice of award of \$2.8 million for the proposed project. The proposed project is to be completed by the end of the grant term on June 30, 2027.

It is recommended that the Board approve the acceptance of the funds and authorize the acting Behavioral Health Director to execute the modified subcontract agreement, and subsequent related routine grant documents, in order to expedite and ensure adherence to project timelines for these critically needed services and housing units.
