First reading held.

ACTION TAKEN: Alex Keeble-Toll, Office of Emergency Services Director, provided a brief presentation regarding fire hazard severity zones (FHSZ). She reviewed the local responsibility areas and the government codes that cover FHSZ. She reported that this effects design and construction of new buildings and will trigger a 100-foot defensible space clearance requirement. She reported that the FHSZ maps are not used to affect insurance rates or insurance availability. In Nevada County there are 6 parcels designated as FHSZ zones. She spoke to the benefits of FHSZ adoption which would prioritize CAL FIRE assistance grant funding for fire risk reduction.

Chair Hall opened the item for public comment. Public comment was received.

MOTION: Motion made by Supervisor Bullock, seconded by Supervisor Swarthout, to introduce and waive further reading of the Ordinance. On a roll call vote, the motion passed unanimously.
