SUBJECT: Resolution approving a renewal contract with Progress House, Inc. for the provision of Perinatal and Non-Perinatal Comprehensive Residential Treatment Program Services including withdrawal management for the recovery of substance use disorders to residents of Nevada County in the maximum amount of \$1,000,000 for the contract term of July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the attached Resolution.

FUNDING: Contract services are supported by Drug Medi-Cal Federal reimbursement and 2011 Realignment. Services were included in the department's budget. There are no county general fund dollars required in the contract.

BACKGROUND: Nevada County continues to experience limited residential Substance Use Disorder (SUD) treatment capacity. In prior years, our largest SUD provider struggled to meet rising demand due to resource constraints and a reduction in available treatment beds. This resulted in long wait times and, in some cases, individuals being unable to access timely residential treatment. The strain from this lack of capacity has been felt across emergency services, hospitals, and the criminal justice system.

The County entered into a contract with Progress House, Inc. specifically to reduce these barriers to care and expand residential treatment access for Nevada County residents. Over the current contract term, this partnership has proven effective in increasing available placement options, reducing delays in treatment entry, and improving our ability to connect individuals to appropriate levels of care when they are ready to engage in services.

Renewal of this contract will allow the County to continue the progress made in addressing these prior access challenges and maintain the additional residential treatment capacity that has become an essential part of our continuum of care.

Under this renewed contract, Progress House, Inc. will continue to provide comprehensive substance use disorder treatment services for Nevada County residents, including the following components:

Full spectrum of Perinatal and Non-Perinatal Services within the modalities of Residential Treatment and Withdrawal Management.

Perinatal Program Services:

The Perinatal Program provides coordinated substance use intervention and treatment services complimented with health care and pertinent ancillary services to pregnant and parenting women of Nevada County. The program includes services such as substance use counseling and education; individual, group, and family counseling; sexual and physical abuse counseling parenting education; HIV/AIDS, TB, and Hep C education and access to testing; and individualized treatment plans for each participant to address their identified problems with treatment goals.

Residential Treatment and Withdrawal Management Programs:

Contractor provides 24 hours / 7 days per week residential programs. The Contractor's residential treatment and withdrawal management programs provide comprehensive treatment services to adult men and women, over the age of 18, in a carefully structured and supportive environment with a high degree of accountability and integrated continuum of care that focuses on each unique individual and their family system.

It is recommended that the Board approve renewal of this contract, as the services provided have strengthened and expanded the County's comprehensive system for substance use disorder intervention, assessment, treatment, and recovery. Continued partnership with this provider will further enhance the well-being of individuals and families and support the achievement and maintenance of healthy, fulfilling lives.
