SUBJECT: Resolution approving the naming of the Campus Loop Trailhead Parking Lot located at the Nevada County Government Center, 950 Maidu Avenue, Nevada City, California, as “Mile One”

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt the resolution.

FUNDING: N/A

BACKGROUND: On May 28, 2024, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution 24-247 approving the Nevada County Recreation and Resiliency Master Plan (RRMP). One of the eight focus areas identified in the RRMP is Sustainable Recreation and Communications, which recommends development and implementation of a multi-jurisdictional wayfinding signage program to strengthen the overall identity and branding of Nevada County and its regional partners while promoting sustainable recreation opportunities.

Consistent with this recommendation, on June 9, 2024, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution 24-412 allocating funding through the 2024 Revised ARPA Expenditure Plan for a multi-jurisdictional wayfinding signage initiative. The initiative supports coordinated recreation messaging, visitor navigation, and sustainable recreation access throughout Nevada County.

Building on this effort, on December 10, 2024, the Board adopted Resolution 24-630 authorizing a contract between the Nevada County Community Development Agency and Bear Yuba Land Trust for the design and implementation of standardized wayfinding signage and communication standards for trails, pathways, and recreation access points throughout Nevada County. The project is intended to support public safety, education, environmental stewardship, and improved connectivity between recreation destinations.

As part of these ongoing recreation and access improvements, construction of the Campus Loop Trailhead Parking Lot at the Nevada County Government Center began in Fall 2025 and is anticipated to be completed in Summer 2026. Upon completion, Bear Yuba Land Trust will install a trailhead kiosk and associated wayfinding signage consistent with the Countywide recreation signage standards established under the contract. The parking lot is intended to serve as a central access point and recreation hub connecting residents and visitors to the developing Pines to Mines Trail and other outdoor recreation opportunities throughout the region.

In accordance with Administrative Policy 24-001, Facilities Naming Policy, the proposed facility name, “Mile One,” was presented to and supported by the Capital Projects Ad Hoc Subcommittee prior to consideration by the full Board of Supervisors. The proposed name is consistent

with County policy in that it is not named after a living individual, is not considered controversial, offensive, or discriminatory, and does not reflect a commercial entity, sponsor, or donor.

The name “Mile One” reflects the site’s role as the trailhead for the first mile of the Pines to Mines Trail, while also symbolizing a starting point for broader outdoor recreation opportunities throughout Nevada County.

It is recommended that the Board adopt the attached resolution approving the name “Mile One” for the Campus Loop Trailhead Parking Lot located at the Nevada County Government Center, 950 Maidu Avenue, Nevada City, California.
