



RESOLUTION No. 16-562

OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NEVADA

RESOLUTION ACCEPTING FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$63,750 FOR THREE ELIGIBLE PROFESSIONALS (\$21,250/EACH) FOR THE FIRST INCENTIVE PAYMENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2016/17 UNDER THE MEDICAID EHR (ELECTRONIC HEALTH RECORDS) INCENTIVE PROGRAM, AND UP TO A MAXIMUM OF \$212,500 OVER THE LIFE OF THE PROGRAM THROUGH 2021

WHEREAS, under the EMR (Electronic Medical Record), sometimes referred to as EHR (Electronic Health Record), Stimulus Incentive Bill, in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 economic stimulus package, incentive payments are made available under either the Medicare Incentives for EHR or the Medicaid Incentive Program; and

WHEREAS, Nevada County Public Health Department received its first Medicaid Incentive payments in Fiscal Year 2016.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors, of the County of Nevada, State of California, that the Nevada County Board of Supervisors accepts funds in the amount of \$63,750 as the first incentive payments for three eligible professionals (\$21,250/each) under the EHR (Electronic Health Record) Program Project for Fiscal Year 2016/17 and up to a maximum of \$212,500 over the life of the program through 2021.

Attachment A

“Meaningful Use” refers to the following criteria:

- 1) Protect electronic health information created or maintained by the certified EHR technology through the implementation of appropriate technical capabilities. Conduct or review a security risk analysis and implement security updates as necessary and correct identified security deficiencies.
- 2) Implement 5 clinical decision support interventions related to clinical quality measures.
- 3) Medication orders directly entered into the medical record.
- 4) Lab orders directly entered into the medical record.
- 5) Radiology orders directly entered into the medical record.
- 6) Implement drug-drug and drug-allergy checks.
- 7) Generate and transmit permissible prescriptions electronically.
- 8) When transitioning care to another health care provider, provide a summary of care document to the other provider.
- 9) Provide patients with patient-specific education resources identified by the EHR.
- 10) Perform medication reconciliation for patients transitioned into care of the provider.
- 11) Provide patients with timely access to view online, download, and transmit to a third party their health information.
- 12) Use secure electronic messaging to communicate with patients on relevant health information.
- 13) Submit electronic public health data from EHR to specialized registries except where prohibited and in accordance with applicable law and practice.
- 14) Report clinical quality measures.
