

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, February 11, 2025 at 10:30 a.m. or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, the Nevada County Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing to consider adoption of a resolution amending special taxes within the Darkhorse Permanent Road Division and impose an annual special tax adjustment in compliance with Proposition 218. The Board of Supervisors shall consider all objections and protests, if any, to the proposed annual special tax adjustment and will tabulate the vote on the proposed special tax. Any interested person shall be permitted to present written and/or oral testimony.

The public meeting will be held at the Eric Rood Administration Center Board of Supervisor Chambers, located at 950 Maidu Avenue, Nevada City.

Any person wishing to offer testimony on this matter may submit comments to the Clerk of the Board *in advance* of the meeting by:

In order for comments to be entered into the administrative record of the meeting, they must be received no later than 4:00 p.m. the day before the meeting.

During the February 11, 2025 public hearing, you may provide live public comments by attending the public hearing at the Eric Rood Administrative Center Board Chambers.

Please provide your name, City or District of residence, and reference the **Darkhorse PRD Special Tax public hearing** as your topic of interest.

The assessment amendment shall be imposed if two thirds (2/3) or more of the ballots submitted are in favor of the assessment, with ballots weighted according to the proportional financial obligation of the affected property. If a majority protest exists the assessment amendment shall not be imposed and the existing special tax will remain in place.

If a two thirds majority of the ballots submitted approve the annual special tax amendment, the Board of Supervisors may adopt a resolution imposing the special tax amendment starting in fiscal year 2025/26 and ending in fiscal year 2045/46. For each fiscal year thereafter, the special tax will be billed and collected in the same manner as County property taxes with no additional inflation factor applied.
