





- Upon CalOES and FEMA request, staff submitted two revised Hazardous Mitigation Grants August 13th and August 21st totaling \$10,283,765 to support:
 - Hazardous roadside vegetation treatment along 317.5 miles of county-maintained roadway
 - Defensible space clearing around homes
 - Defensible Space Inspector program
- Submitted two pre-applications to Sierra Nevada Conservancy to extend the Ponderosa West Grass Valley Defense Zone Project onto adjacent BLM lands to the west. Both pre-applications totaled: \$1,099,400






Initiative: Update and enforce the County's Hazardous Vegetation Ordinance

On April 10, I sent the attached letter regarding Ponderosa West Grass Valley Defense Zone – Fuel Break Project. All the conditions previously mentioned are still valid. However, I have made the below amendment:

The proposed project will build off a larger multi-phased fuel break and extend the fuel break approximately 1200 acres using a combination of hand crews (30%), heavy equipment (30%), chipping (30%) and biomass (10%).

- Hazardous fuels treatment began on a portion of County land on August 20th









Initiative: Complete the Ponderosa West Fuel Break Project

Progress Update:

- 83 Right of Entry permits have been secured for permission to treat a total of 752.93 acres
- 59% of project Right of Entry permits have been secured
- 4 Denial of Entry permits have been received
- The goal is to complete treatment of 300 acres by December 31, 2019
- The remaining ~900 acres will be complete by February 2020
- Open House Community Meeting scheduled for September 4th, 6:30-9:00pm, Main Street Center Building, Nevada County Fairgrounds
