RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY, OR THEIR DISIGNEE(S), TO APPLY TO THE OFFICE OF JUVENILE JUSTICE AND DELINQUENCY PREVENTION FY25 STRATEGIES TO SUPPORT CHILDREN EXPOSED TO VIOLENCE PROGRAM FOR UP TO \$830,000.00 FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025/26 THROUGH 2028/29, AND AUTHORIZING THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY, OR THEIR DESIGNEE(S) TO EXECUTE ALL REQUIRED GRANT DOCUMENTS

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Justice (DOJ), through the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquancy Program (OJJDP), has announced the availability of funding under the OJJDP FY25 Strategies to Support Children Exposed to Violence Program; and


WHEREAS, applicants can request up to \$830,000.00 for the period of October 1, 2025 through September 30, 2028; and

WHEREAS, this funding opportunity is intended to support the development of services for children who have been exposed to violence in their homes, schools, and communities, while also enhancing and implementing strategies to reduce violent crime, with a focus on violent juvenile offenders; and

WHEREAS, these efforts will aim to prevent and reduce the impact of violence through the use of evidence-based practices and mental health services for children affected by trauma and exposure to violence; and

WHEREAS, if awarded, funds from this program would enable the Nevada County District Attorney's Office to staff the multidisciplinary Family Justice Center, enhancing its capacity to provide services to families with children who have experienced exposure to violence.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Nevada, State of California, hereby authorizes the District Attorney, or their designee(s), to apply for funding through the DOJ OJJDP FY25 Strategies to Support Children Exposed to Violence Program in an amount up to \$830,000.00 for fiscal years 2025/26 through 2028/29, and further authorizes the District Attorney, or their designee(s), to execute all required grant documents.



Executive Summary

This funding opportunity seeks to develop support services for children exposed to violence in their homes, schools, and communities; and to develop, enhance, and implement violent crime reduction strategies that focus on violent juvenile offenders. The goals of the program are to: 1) reduce the incidence of violence through accountability efforts for juvenile offenders; 2) respond to victimization of children whether because of violence that occurs in the school, community or family; and 3) increase protective factors to prevent juvenile violence, delinquency, and victimization. OJP is committed to advancing work that furthers DOJ's mission to uphold the rule of law, to keep our country safe, and to protect civil rights. OJP provides federal leadership, funding, and other critical resources to directly support law enforcement, combat violent crime, protect American children, provide services to American crime victims, and address public safety challenges, including human trafficking and the opioid crisis.
