Recommendation

Approve the contract between the Nevada County Resource Conservation District and the Nevada County Office of Emergency Services for the Lower Deer Creek — Penn Valley Hazardous Fuels Reduction Project (HMGP DR-4683-1084-57 Phase 1) in the amount of \$145,309.00 for use during the period September 23, 2025, through July 3, 2026, authorizing the Director of Emergency Services to execute the contract and directs the Auditor Controller to amend the Fiscal Year 2025/26 Emergency Services Budget (4/5 Affirmative Vote Required)
