I highly recommend Andrew Wilkinson's work (CEO and President of Nevada County Fiber, Inc). His passion, vision, and leadership will safeguard a timely and satisfactory completion of the proposed project. 2. Based on my personal experience with wired fiber-optic broadband, I am absolutely convinced that it is the safest, healthiest, and most reliable option for broadband service on the market. It safeguards public health in that it avoids risks of harmful EMF exposure from wireless connections and facilities such as cell phone towers or small cell antennas (also called CPMRA-WTFs/Close Proximity Microwave Radiation Antenna Wireless Telecommunications Facilities). 3. Nevada County Fiber Inc.'s project will engage in construction that is underground and will offer wired, super-reliant broadband Internet connections to a rural area that is in desperate need of improvements as the only current choice in that area is continually failing AT&T DSL connections. 4. Underground fiber-optics broadband requires low maintenance and will likely last 60+ years. It is also a much safer option with regard to environmental threats such as forest fires, extreme weather patterns, and rodent or other animal damage to facilities/utilities. 5. In addition, Nevada County Fiber, Inc is proposing 'public safety pods' on major evacuation routes which could improve public safety during wildland fire evacuations. 6.
