Please read the following comment at the next Board of Supervisors meeting.

It is important to track, through data collection and reports, just how many AB109 individuals are homeless and how many of that number are being re-arrested. Our knowledge of re-arrests of this population is important to track, *even if they are not reconvicted*. Our recidivism rate (14%) might be low, but it does not reflect the *re-arrest data of homeless AB109 felons* who remain problematic for the police and our communities. Public safety is one of the primary goals of Realignment.

The CCP needs to find a solution to our homeless AB109 felon problem via the implementation of a rigorous Partnership Plan and a budget that reflects this goal. Under no circumstances should AB109 felons be released into the community without a safe place to live. (*safe for the public*)

Suggestions:

(1). Use the old Juvenile Hall for housing, or set up a safe camping situation on the 20 acres of property adjacent to the Juvenile Hall so Probation can monitor homeless felons in one location; providing treatment and support services using AB109 State Funding. Homeless felons being released from jail would go here instead of into the greater community. Following a risk-assessment hearing, if the individual does not have housing they would be mandated to live here while under supervision, instead of being released into the community.

(2). The Sheriff and Probation Departments would provide a list of AB109 individuals (released from jail and on probation) to the Police Departments, Forensic Specialist, Hospitality House, the HOME team, and the newly established Mobil Crisis Teams, so they can record every contact. Data of contacts, the reason for the contact, and re-arrests, will then be analyzed as to the impact AB109 felons are having in the community. Are we really reducing recidivism?

(3). Re-establish the CCP. The CCP has not met since May of 2019. It's time to resume the meetings and set new goals. For transparency it is important to post the agendas prior to the meeting and then post the minutes. Agendas have never been posted and this includes the Executive Committee meetings, which plan the budget.

(4). Invite the public to participate in the CCP meetings by making the community aware of the CCP.

I am a resident of the Grandview Terrace neighborhood in Nevada County. Our neighborhood sits on the Grass Valley city limits and borders Empire Mine's Union Hill section and is close to Bennett Street. In the past year, many new neighbors have moved in our neighborhood, some with small children and others with grandchildren. They are improving their homes and enjoying the forest, trails, and beauty surrounding us.

I am very concerned that permitting and operating Idaho Maryland Mine, a full-scale industrial mining operation with tons of truck traffic, blasting, and dewatering the groundwater, will impact our quality of life and eventually ruin the economic growth I am witnessing.

Also, I spent over a decade with U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and evaluated Superfund mine cleanups. Mines have left us a toxic cleanup legacy. Regarding the possible re opening of the Idaho Maryland mine, I have some questions for you.



Make a comment to the Nevada County Board of Supervisors

Why should I make a comment to the County?

Nevada County is now preparing a Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) that could be ready as early as the fall of 2020. It is up to citizens to ask questions and voice concerns about the project. **Ultimately, the decision on the mine will be made by the five members of the Nevada County Board of Supervisors.**

How can I submit a comment to the Board of Supervisors?

The Nevada County Board of Supervisors meets on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of each month. Note the upcoming calendar has different dates to accommodate holidays. (10/27, 11/10, 11/17, and 12/15)

The best way to make a comment to the Board is in-person, but you can also leave a voice mail that the Board will hear or a letter that the Board Secretary will read to the Board during public comment. (See below with directions on how to leave a voice mail or submit a letter.)

To make an in-person comment, go to the kiosk at the Rood Center by 8:55 am and a staff person will give you instructions on how to comment. Masks are required in the Rood Center. Public comment should begin around 9:05 am.

Talking points for comments

Your comments should **be no longer than 3 minutes** and focus on 2-3 points you'd like to make. We suggest writing your key bullet points or scripting your entire comment.

1. Begin by stating your name, the neighborhood or district you reside in, and the issue that you are commenting on.

2. Add your personal experience or give context by explaining why you are involved and care about this issue, what your profession is, or why you like living in Grass Valley or Nevada County.

3. Make a clear statement of what you want the BOS to do or consider.

For example "The County needs to do an economic study as part of the public environmental review process because...."

(Here are some ideas to spark ideas on your comments. Please put in your own words, add personal experience and your own concerns.)

• **Air quality** impacts from blasting, drilling, and crushing rock as part of operations. Our AQ is already compromised.

• Millions of gallons of water will be discharged into **South Fork Wolf Creek** and that could impact water quality by significant increases in flow rates, potentially mobilizing contaminated sediments and damaging the riparian habitat downstream and increase flood risk in downtown Grass Valley.

• Neighborhoods would be impacted by the new truck traffic, noise, and vibration of large-scale, industrial-level mine operations.

• Over 300 wells are directly over the area of Rise's mineral rights. Citizens and homeowners are concerned about the potential loss or harm to their wells.

• The County needs to look at the economic risks and potential financial impacts to homeowners, citizens, and businesses; however, the current environmental review process doesn't include any analysis or study of those economic impacts. Urge the County to include an economic analysis in the Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR).

• Rise Gold owns two properties, with one of those parcels (the so-called Centennial property along Idaho-Maryland Road and Centennial drive), has been facing a Superfund Designation because of historic mining operations and is now being reviewed by the DTSC without consideration of the plans to dump more tailings there That site isn't included in the current project analysis and it needs to be.

Dear Supervisors,

I am writing in support of Dr. Richard Johnson's Order regarding influenza vaccines and health care workers.

In the decades since they have become widely available, influenza vaccines have been proven to be safe and effective. Like any vaccine, they are not 100% effective, but they significantly reduce the chances of the recipient getting influenza. Health care workers, who often take care of our medically most vulnerable citizens, have a professional and ethical duty to help their patients and to do no harm to them. By any definition, being the source of transmission of influenza to patients is certainly doing harm to them. Health care workers can reduce that risk by having an influenza vaccine each year. Studies have shown that voluntary influenza vaccine programs do not achieve the needed vaccination rate among health care personnel. Under Dr. Johnson's order, those with a valid medical or religious reason to not have the vaccine can opt out.

In my opinion, we should do everything we can to prevent influenza every year, but we must be especially vigilant In the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic. Our economy, our health care workforce, and our citizens cannot afford to have a severe flu season any year, but especially this year.

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



45 years ago, my wonderful son was born at home. The birth was the most beautiful experience of my life, and unto me an incandescently radiant son was born. I watched, in horror, as that radiance drained from my son's eyes and limbs on administration of his first recommended vaccine. I watched, as my son was vaccine-injured at only a few months old. The doctors told me that what I had seen was incorrect... that the vaccine was absolutely undisputedly safe. I know what I witnessed. I know what we've lived, my son and I, as a result of that irrefutable experience. Dear Board of Supervisors,

We know the Covid-19 pandemic has placed strains on everyone around the world. People have tragically lost loved ones without being able to be at their side in their last moments, families have not been able to visit with their relatives or close friends in the hospital, some have lost their jobs and businesses have closed, some permanently. All of these conditions are becoming more of a threat to our society than the virus itself. Think of the impact of a "locked down" society on the mental health of its citizens.

Currently the County has been using the Grass Valley Veterans Memorial Building (GVVMB) for Covid-19 testing. The Veterans Organizations that make up the Nevada County Consolidated Veterans Council (NCCVC) have been 'locked out' of the Building for the last six months because the community needed it for the public good. However, in the last couple months the Delegates of the NCCVC and their members have expressed concerns that there could be some other location more suited to Covid-19 testing.

As of October 23rd the County is on the lower end of the "Moderate" rating used by the state to determine risk. We are within five tenths of a percent of being rated "Minimal". This would indicate that we are doing those things necessary to increase social interaction in western Nevada County.

Over the time the veterans have been "locked out" of the Building we have been forced to meet on a limited basis in parks and/or the homes of members. Under these conditions not all members have been able to attend meetings or take part in the limited activities associated with their Organizations. Such activity is the upcoming annual Toys For Tots program. The GVVMB is traditionally used to sort and distribute toys to over 900 children that otherwise might not receive any for Christmas. Another is the annual Recognition Dinner for the Volunteers at the Nevada County Food Bank. Without the use of the GVVMB finding an alternative location for civic activities such as these could cause an undue and unplanned expense to the organizations and thereby reduce their impact to the community.

The point is the NCCVC strongly urges the County to move Covid-19 testing to a more suitable location and open the GVVMB for use by the various Veterans Organizations.
