## **OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NEVADA**

### **RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING A LOCAL EMERGENCY IN NEVADA COUNTY DUE TO THE JONES FIRE (4/5 AFFIRMATIVE VOTE REQUIRED)**

WHEREAS, on August 17, 2020 in the early morning hours a wildfire commenced near Jones Bar Rd. northwest of Nevada City, which has been named the “Jones Fire;” and

WHEREAS, the health, safety, and property of thousands of Nevada County residents living in and around the fire zone continues to be threatened, and has resulted in mass mandatory and voluntary evacuations and the destruction of multiple homes and structures; and

WHEREAS, on August 17, 2020, at approximately 4:30 a.m., Nevada County commenced emergency services and opened its emergency shelters to provide food, shelter, emergency supplies, social services, medical attention, and transportation for evacuees and their animals, as well as other necessary services to address the rapidly changing and emergent circumstances created by the Jones Fire; and

WHEREAS, on August 18, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services for the County of Nevada proclaimed the existence of a local emergency as a result of the Jones Fire and the associated threat to the health and safety of thousands of residents living in and around the fire zone; and

WHEREAS, on August 18, 2020, the Governor of California declared a statewide emergency to help ensure the availability of vital resources to combat fires burning across the state, which have been exacerbated by the effects of the historic West Coast heat wave and sustained high winds; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors finds that the conditions created by the Jones Fire are likely to continue and remain beyond the control, capacity, and resources of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of Nevada County, and that a local emergency and emergency situation exists as set forth in California Government Code sections 8630 and 54956.5; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid conditions of extreme peril warrant and necessitate the Proclamation of the Existence of a Local Emergency; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid emergency necessitates the immediate expenditure of public monies to protect health, safety and property without complying with competitive bidding and other local purchasing, bidding, and procurement requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Nevada, State of California hereby Confirms and Proclaims that a local emergency now exists in Nevada County due to the impacts caused by the Jones Fire.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Nevada, State of California hereby directs that:

1. The Proclamation of Existence of a Local Emergency shall be renewed and deemed to continue to exist as provided by state law or until its termination is proclaimed by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Nevada.
2. The Director of Emergency Services for the County of Nevada is hereby designated as the authorized representative of the County of Nevada for the purpose of receipt, processing, and coordination of all inquiries and requirements necessary to obtain available State and Federal assistance.
3. During the existence of said local emergency, competitive bidding and other local purchasing, bidding, and procurement requirements related to the Local Emergency are suspended.
4. The Director of Emergency Services or his designee immediately forward a certified copy of this resolution proclaiming a local emergency to the Governor of California with a request that the Governor declare a State of Emergency for the County of Nevada.
5. During the existence of said local emergency the powers, functions, and duties of the Director of Emergency Services, or his designee, and the emergency organization of the County shall be those prescribed by state law, local ordinance and resolutions of this county approved by the Board of Supervisors, as approved by the Board of Supervisors.

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that Nevada County requests to the State that recovery assistance be made available under the California Disaster Assistance Act; and that the State expedite access to State and Federal resources and any other appropriate Federal disaster relief programs.
