# 1 BACKGROUND

Section 1797.270 *et seq* of the California Health and Safety Code permits counties to have an Emergency Medical Care Committee (EMCC), and resolution #07-593 of the Nevada County Board of Supervisors established such a committee to advise the Board and the Sierra-Sacramento Valley Emergency Services Agency (S-SV) on issues concerning provision of emergency medical services in Nevada County.

# A | Annual Reporting

The Health and Safety Code proposes that the EMCC shall, at least annually, review the operations of each of the following:

- Ambulance services operating within the county,
- Emergency medical care offered within the county, including programs for training large numbers
  of people in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and lifesaving first aid techniques, and
- First aid practices in the county.

This report to the Board and S-SV is a fulfillment of that responsibility.





# CPR, First Aid, and Other Instructional Forums in 2018

at transport agencies providers, the American Red cross and various fire service agencies throughout the year.



#### **HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2018:**

- **Additional Paramedic program**. The Grass Valley Fire Department has begun organizing a non-transporting paramedic program. Expected completion in 2019.
- **Improvements in mass casualty planning**. Transport, non-transport and law enforcement partners conducted many hours of multi-discipline training for incidents involving mass casualties from accidents and violent encounters resulting in improved interagency abilities to mitigate these emergencies.
- **Community minded.** Several EMS providers provide low cost CPR training to a wide variety of community groups, schools and civic organizations throughout the county
- **Mutual Aid Support.** Multiple Ambulance Strike Teams were mobilized to assist the EMS systems in Shasta and Butte counties due to fire activity.

#### **CHALLENGES FROM 2018:**

- **Peak call activity strains.** All transport providers continue working together to ensure timely ambulance response when peak activity hits the system. As call volume grows this becomes ever more important.
- **Elevated community need.** Nevada County continues to have a significant homeless population requiring EMS assistance. This further adds to a reduction in ambulance availability, especially affecting the system during winter months.
- Mental health presentations. Nevada County continues to see heavy use of the EMS system for mental health issues. Mental health holds in the ED have increased in number and extended stays in the ED have increased wait times as well as increased demand on staffing and a demand for additional security and safety training at hospitals.
