

**NEVADA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
IS SEEKING INTERESTED PERSONS TO SERVE ON THE FOLLOWING:**

***ADULT AND FAMILY SERVICES COMMISSION:** (2 vacancies) One Public member and one Disabled and Non-profit Agency member, both to fill 2-year unexpired terms ending April 30, 2016. This Commission shall operate under the Board of Supervisors as the primary advisory body on issues relative to adult and family health and human services needs of all residents of Nevada County, and shall perform the responsibilities of the Community Action Board (CAB) Title II, Section 201(a) of the Economic Opportunity Act. ***AREA 4 AGENCY ON AGING ADVISORY COUNCIL:** (2 vacancies) Two Board of Supervisors appointed representatives; one to fill a 3-year unexpired term ending June 30, 2016 and one to fill a 3-year unexpired term ending June 30, 2017. The Advisory Council shall advise the area agency on all matters relating to development and administration of the Area Plan and operations conducted thereunder. ***AREA 4 AGENCY ON AGING GOVERNING BOARD:** (1 position) One non-supervisor member position available for a two year term beginning January 1, 2016. The governing board shall establish all policy; procedural rules for expenditure and obligation and conditions on the use of funds; enter into and administer contracts and sub grants for the purpose of carrying out the intent and functions of the OAA and any other pertinent grant programs; adopt the area plan and annual budget; and perform all its responsibilities in accordance with OAA, the Older Californians Act (OCA), and all other pertinent laws, regulations and rules. ***ASSESSMENT APPEALS BOARD:** (1 vacancy) One alternate vacancy for an unexpired 1-yr. term expiring September 30, 2016. Specific qualifications are required per Section 1624 of the Revenue and Taxation Code. The function of the Appeals Board is to determine the full value of property or to determine other matters of property tax assessment over which the Appeals Board has jurisdiction. The Board acts in a quasi-judicial capacity and renders its decision only on the basis of proper evidence presented at the hearing. The functions of the Board are outlined in Section 1620 et seq. of the Revenue and Taxation Code. Compensated per Administrative Code Chapter II, Article 13.11. BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE LAW LIBRARY: (3 Positions) One Chair of the Board of Supervisors representative and two trustee positions. This board governs the County law library and was established under the provisions of Chapter 52 of the Business & Professions Code. ***BUILDING AND ACCESSIBILITY STANDARDS BOARD OF APPEALS:** (2 vacancies) One District V vacancy appointed by the District V Supervisor to fill a 4-yr. unexpired term ending July 1, 2018, and one vacancy for a member-at-large who shall be a disabled person appointed by a majority of the County Board of Supervisors. All members must be qualified by experience and training to pass on matters pertaining to building construction, building service equipment and grading. Members are appointed from the County at-large, without regard to district. This Board rules on appeals of discretionary orders and decisions or determinations made by the Building Official relative to; the application and interpretation of the provisions of the technical codes; State mandated energy regulations contained in Title 24 California Code of Regulations and requirements of the Historical Building Code; and the enforcement of the California Disabled Access Regulations (Health and Safety Code Sec. 19955, et seq.). ***FISH AND WILDLIFE COMMISSION:** (1 vacancy and 1 position) One Member-at-Large representative for a four-year term ending January 31, 2020 and one position available January 31, 2015 for a four-year term ending January 31, 2020. NEVADA COUNTY SANITATION DISTRICT NO. 1 ADVISORY COMMITTEE: (7 vacancies) One Lake Wildwood Zone 1 alternate, one Cascade Shores Zone 8 representative, one Cascade Shores Zone 8 alternate, and one Eden Ranch Zone 9 representative to fill 2-yr. terms expiring June 30, 2017, one Lake of the Pines Zone 2 alternate, one North San Juan Zone 4 representative and one Gold Creek Zone 5 representative to fill 2-yr. terms expiring June 30, 2016. 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***SEWAGE DISPOSAL TECHNICAL ADVISORY GROUP:** (1 vacancy) One consultant appointed by District III Supervisor selected from the County-at-large to serve at the pleasure of the appointing supervisor. Consultant is defined in County of Nevada On-Site Sewage Disposal Ordinance 1975 as one of the following; Certified Engineering Geologist, Certified Professional Soil Scientist, Registered Civil Engineer, Registered Environmental Health Specialist, or Registered Geologist. Said group members may not be employees of the County of Nevada. Each group member will be qualified by experience and training to pass on matters pertaining to sewage disposal. The purpose will be to review and recommend proposed revisions and additions to the sewage disposal regulations or sewage disposal ordinance in an advisory capacity; review and recommend new methods, techniques, and materials for on-site sewage disposal, in an advisory capacity; and serve as an appeal body under the provisions of Section A-032 of County Resolution 98-217. ***TRUCKEE CEMETERY DISTRICT:** (1 position available December 9, 2015) One public member to fill an unexpired four year term ending July 1, 2018, who must reside in and be a registered voter in the Truckee Cemetery District. This Board meets on a monthly basis and determines action and policies in the maintenance and management of the Truckee Cemetery District. ***TRUCKEE REDEVELOPMENT SUCCESSOR AGENCY OVERSIGHT BOARD:** (1 vacancy) One Public Member appointed by the Board of Supervisors to serve at the pleasure of the Board. AB 1X 26 requires that each redevelopment agency be dissolved unless the community that created it enacts an ordinance committing it to making certain payments effective February 1, 2012 per the Supreme Court's final decision in upholding the legislation. AB 1X 26 provides that successor agencies be designated as successor entities to the former redevelopment agencies and provides that with certain exceptions all authority, rights, powers, duties and obligations previously vested with the former redevelopment agencies under the California Redevelopment Law (CRL) are vested in the successor agencies. On January 19, 2012 the Truckee Town Council adopted Resolution 2012-05 electing to serve as the successor agency to the former Redevelopment Agency. AB 1X 26 further provides that the successor agency activities are subject to review and approval by an Oversight Board which shall be created for each dissolved redevelopment agency.
