

### Children in Poverty (Regions of 20,000 Residents or More): 2005-2007 to 2010-2012






#### Why Education Matters?



Our local public school district, Tahoe Truckee Unified School District, holds a vision that all scholars are prepared for college, careers and life and provides extensive programs for preschool to college-aged students.

Overall, Tahoe Truckee elementary to college-aged student out-perform their peers across California in many areas.









#### SNAPSHOT: Local Public Education

The Tahoe Truckee Unified School District (TTUSD) covers one of the largest geographic areas of any California District at 720 square miles

TTUSD serves pre-k through 12th grade students in 12 schools

3,917 total TTUSD enrollment 2013

5% decline in TTUSD enrollment since 2007, down from a 26% decline 2002-2007

21% of TTUSD students in 2013 were English Learners

37% of TTUSD students in 2013 received free or reduced lunch

90% 2013 TTUSD High School Graduation Rate

80% 2013 California High School Graduation Rate.
