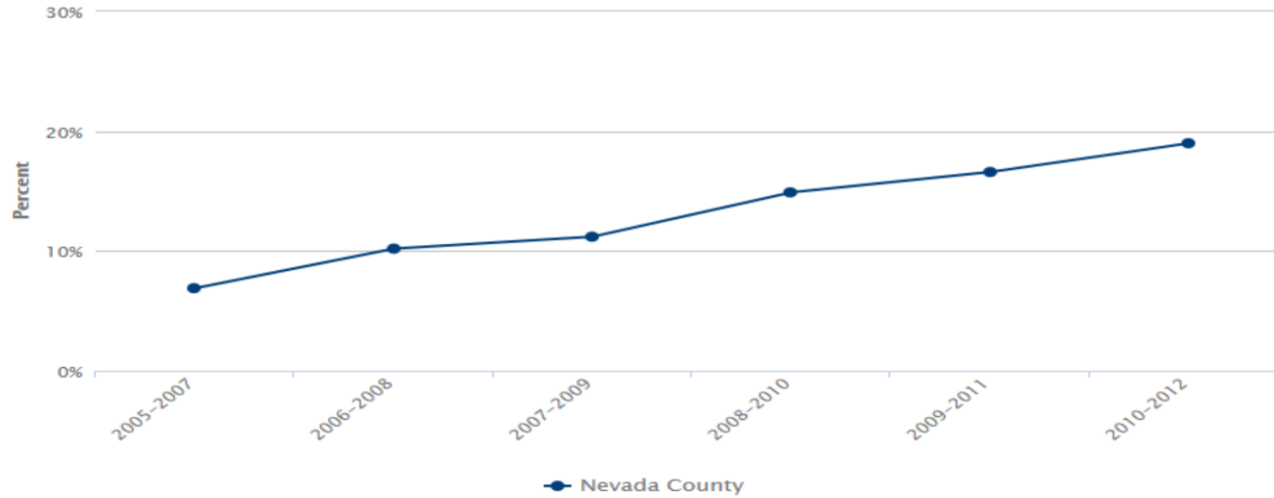

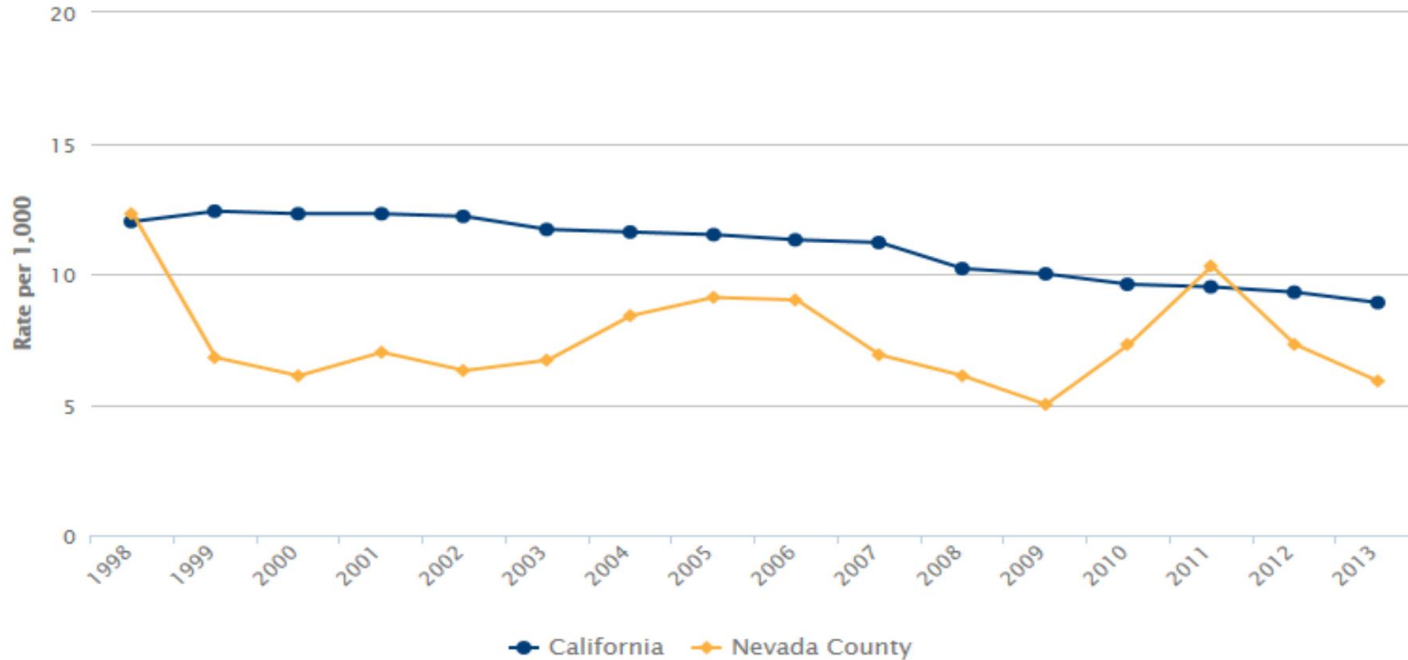
## Children in Poverty (Regions of 20,000 Residents or More): 2005-2007 to 2010-2012

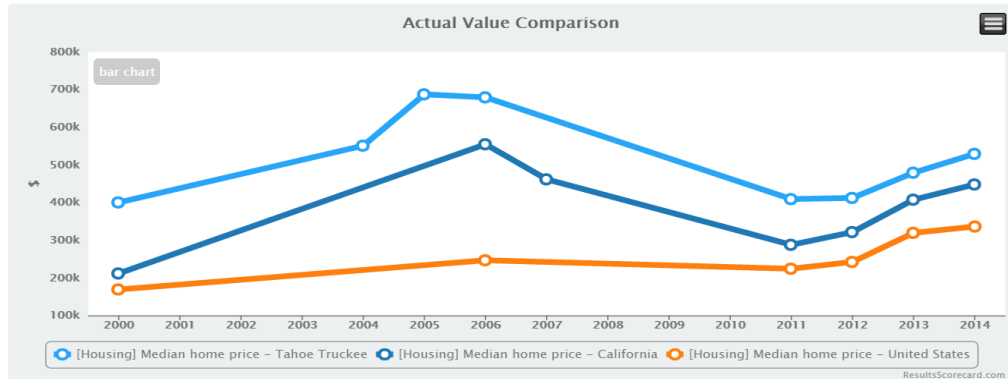

The Tahoe Sierra Multiple Listing Service reports the median and average home price. The median home price is the price that is midway between the least expensive and most expensive home sold in an area from January 1 until December 31. Median home price is considered more accurate as an indicator than an average price, which can be skewed by a few high priced home sales.

### Why Education Matters?

Our local public school district, Tahoe Truckee Unified School District, holds a vision that all scholars are prepared for college, careers and life and provides extensive programs for preschool to college-aged students.

Overall, Tahoe Truckee elementary to college-aged student out-perform their peers across California in many areas.

### SNAPSHOT: Local Public Education

The Tahoe Truckee Unified School District (TTUSD) covers one of the largest geographic areas of any California District at **720 square miles**

TTUSD serves pre-k through 12<sup>th</sup> grade students in **12 schools**

**3,917** total TTUSD enrollment 2013

**5%** decline in TTUSD enrollment since 2007, down from a **26%** decline 2002-2007

**21%** of TTUSD students in 2013 were English Learners

**37%** of TTUSD students in 2013 received free or reduced lunch

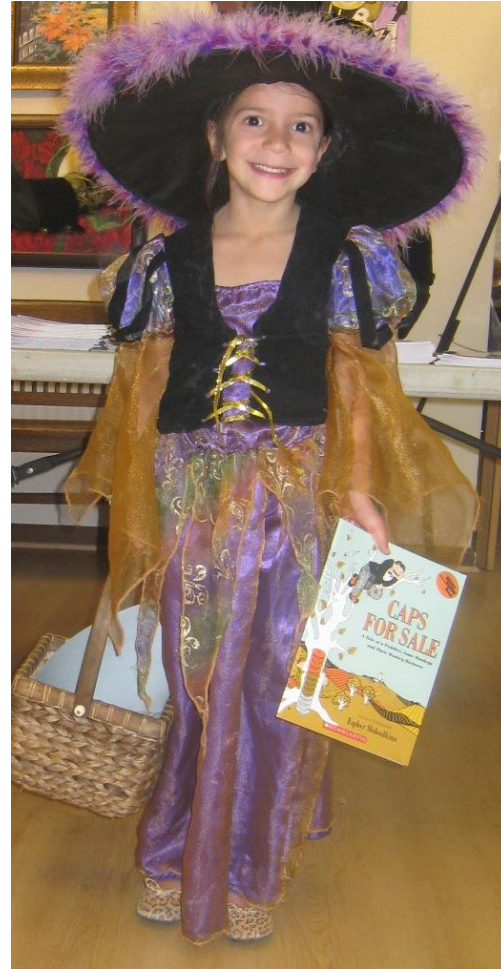
