

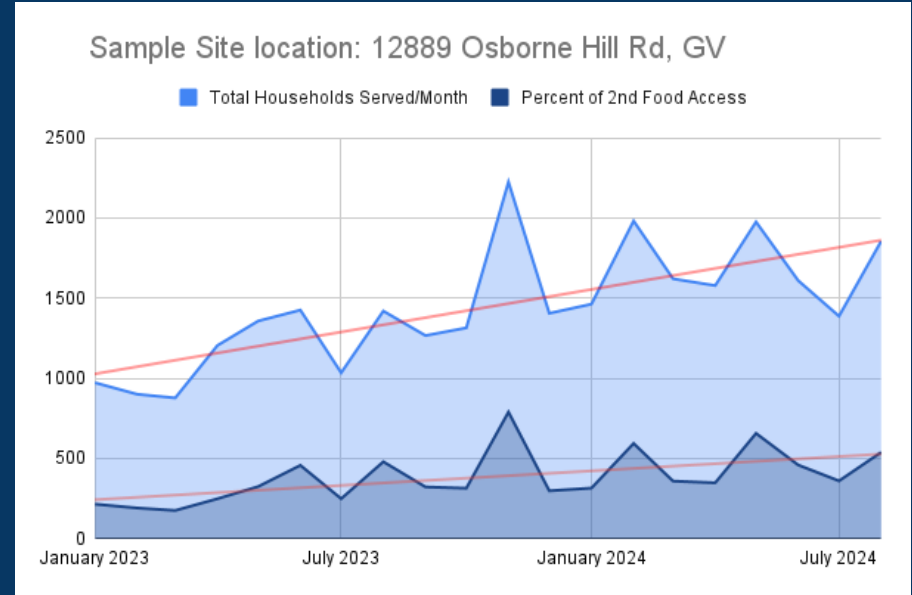

Food Distribution Programs



- **Direct & Rural Food Distribution**: various locations across the county
- **Home Delivery Program**: 100 households for the homebound and elderly or disabled
- **Community Agency Program**: support to 23 local nonprofits in our area

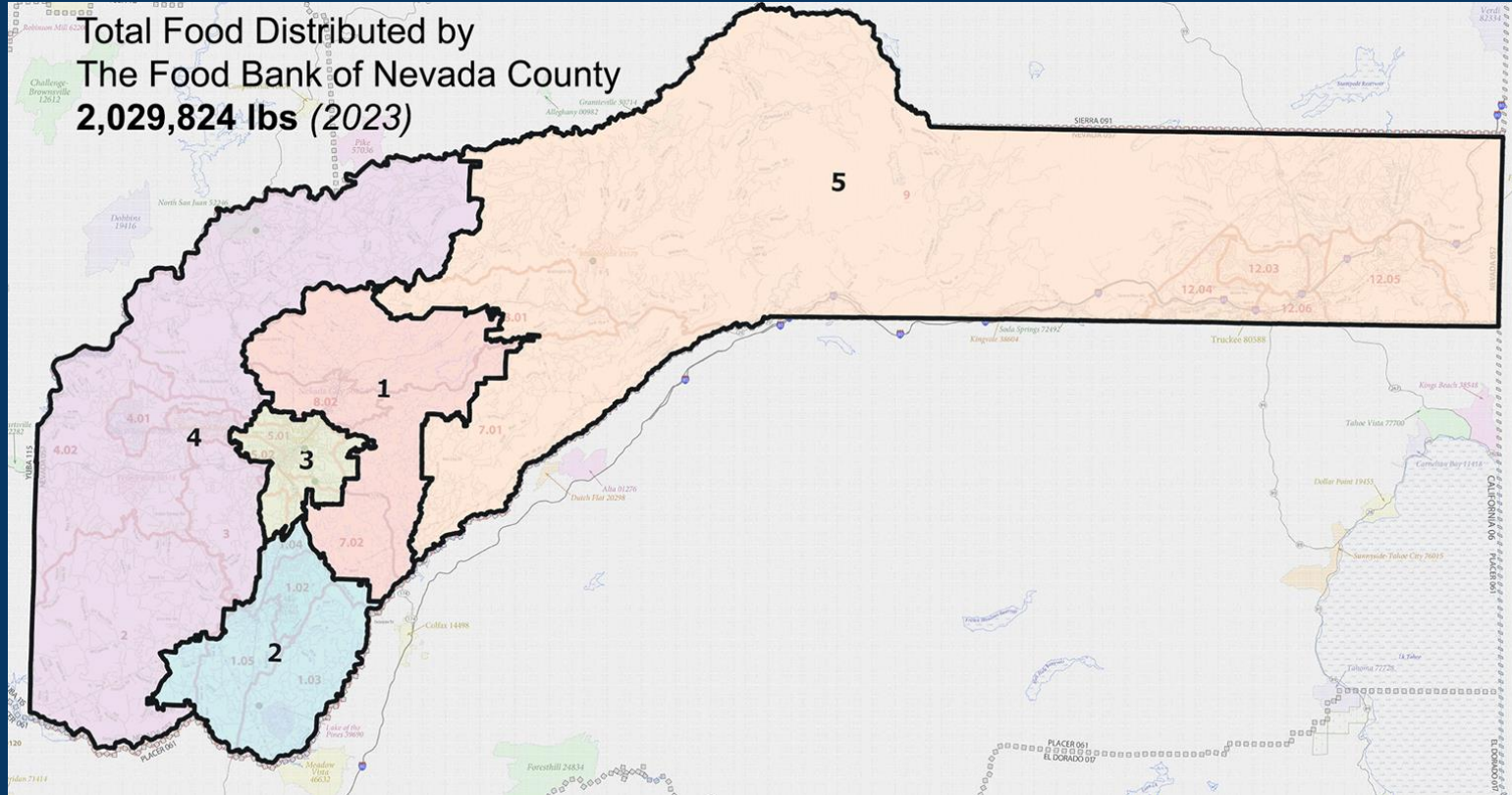

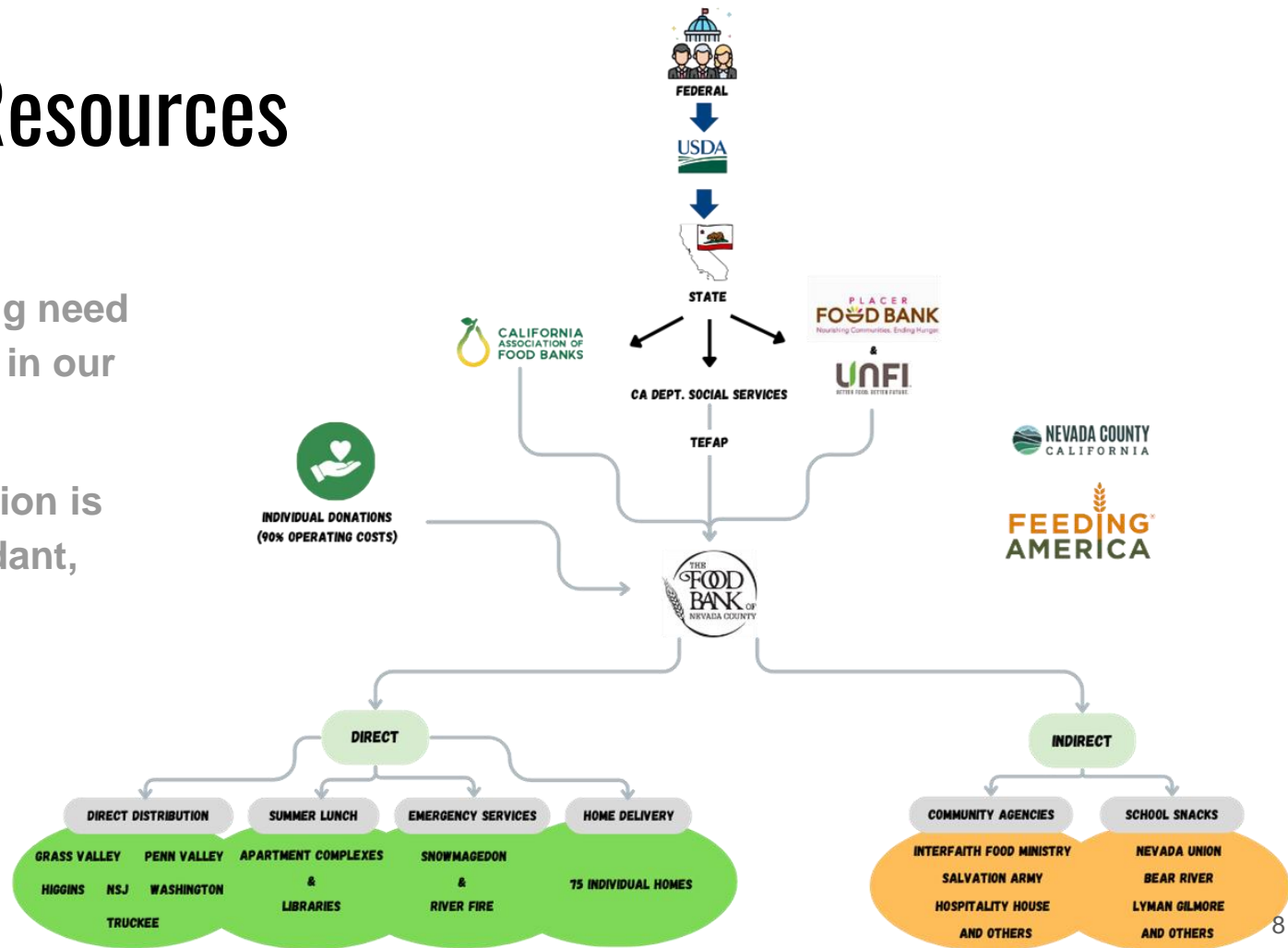

The current solution is scattered, redundant, and incohesive.



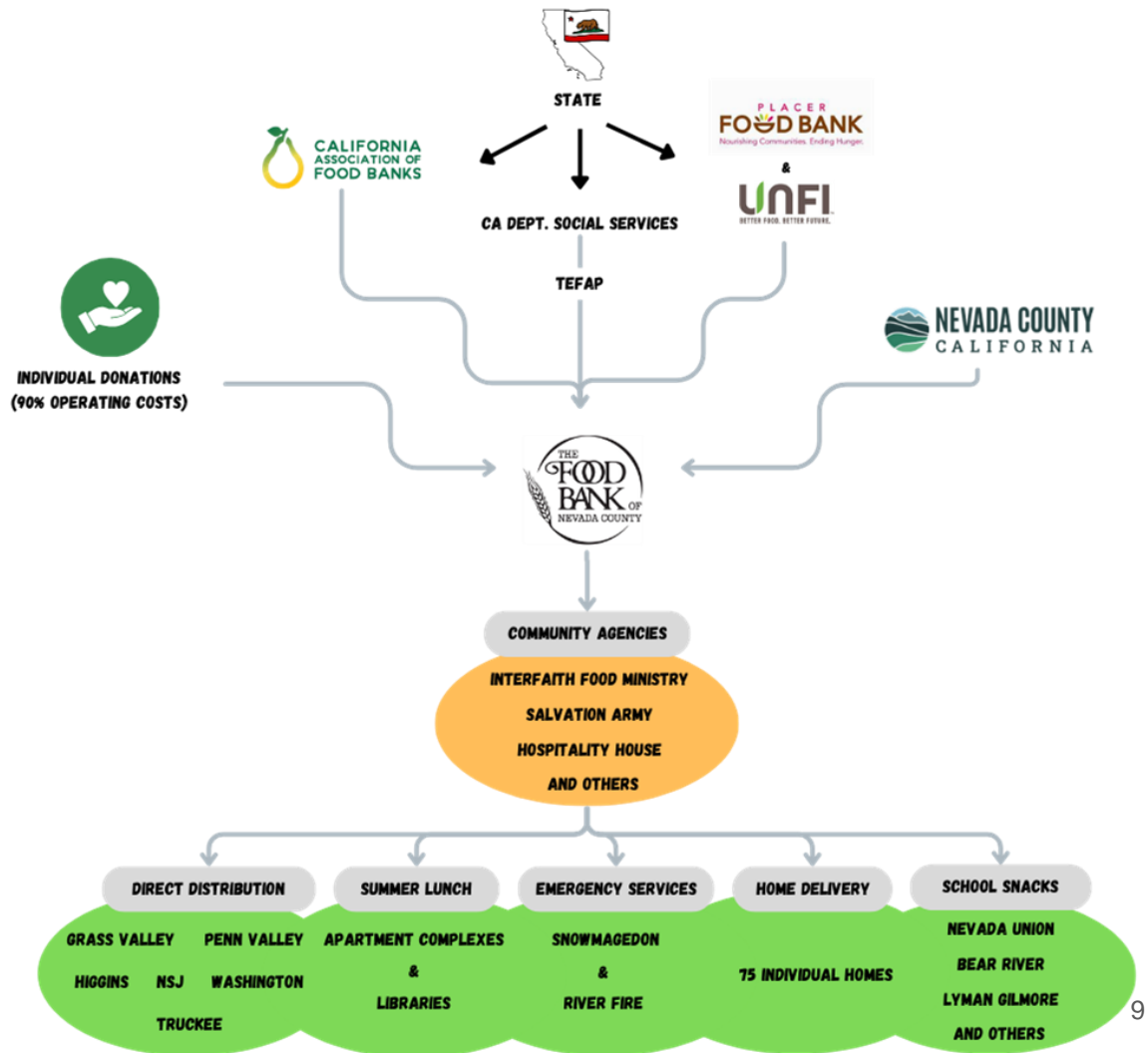
Our Vision
