SUBJECT: Resolution approving a renewal contract with Midvalley Recovery Facilities, Inc, DBA Pathways, for the provision of residential treatment and withdrawal management services for referred clients of Nevada County in the amount of \$450,000 for the Agreement term of July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the attached Resolution.

FUNDING: Contract Services are supported by Drug Medi-Cal Federal reimbursement, Substance Use Block Grant (SUBG) funds from SAMHSA and 2011 Realignment. Services are within the Behavioral Health FY 2025/26 budget and there are no county general fund dollars required in the Agreement.

BACKGROUND: This is a renewal contract for services related to residential substance use treatment for Nevada County residents. The contract includes Withdrawal Management programs and Residential Treatment.

Residential Treatment and Withdrawal Management Programs

Contractor provides 24 hours a day, 7 days per week residential programs for individuals identified as having a substance use disorder. The Contractor's residential treatment and withdrawal management programs provide comprehensive treatment services to adult women and men over the age of 18 in a carefully structured and supportive environment with a high degree of accountability and integrated continuum of care that focuses on each unique individual and their family system. Licensed medical staff ensure that withdrawal management services are safe and comfortable. Linkage services are provided, as well as relapse prevention and individualized discharge planning. Midvalley Recovery Facilities, Inc. operates one fully licensed residential facility in Marysville, CA that is licensed and certified by the state to provide withdrawal management services and residential treatment services to 23 men and women.

All clients treated under this contract will be pre-authorized for services by the Behavioral Health

Department before admission to the program. Clients referred for residential services will be evaluated by program staff and provided a full assessment. They will be assigned a Primary Counselor to collaborate with on developing their Individual Treatment Plan. The residential program prioritizes transition planning and discharge planning, beginning at intake to support successful reintegration into the community.

It is recommended that the Board approve this renewal contract as services provided are designed to help individuals and families recover from the effects of substance use disorders and achieve healthy and stable lives.
