**SUBJECT:** Resolution accepting the California Office of Emergency Services grant award FJ25022602 for the Family Justice Center Program in an amount of \$312,500 for a performance period of April 1, 2026, through March 31, 2028, and authorizing the District Attorney, or their designee(s) to execute all required grant documents, and directing the Auditor-Controller to amend the District Attorney's fiscal year 2025/26 budget (4/5 affirmative vote required).

**RECOMMENDATION:** Adopt the Resolution.

**FUNDING:** The award is \$312,500 and will be distributed via reimbursement over the course of the 24-month grant period, which is April 1, 2026-March 31, 2028. No match is required. A budget modification is needed for fiscal year 2025/26 to include one quarter of revenue and expenditures. Fiscal year 2026/27 will also need a modification contingent upon the adoption of the fiscal year 2026/27.

**BACKGROUND:** The 2025-26 State Budget Act appropriated \$10,000,000 to provide grants to Family Justice Centers throughout the State to support and provide legal services to victims of domestic violence, intimate partner violence, sexual assault, child abuse, elder abuse, transnational abandonment, and human trafficking, and to help victims file petitions for protective orders, including domestic violence restraining orders and gun violence restraining orders.

This is the first year that the District Attorney's Office has been awarded this grant. The office received funding through the Emerging Family Justice Center previously which enabled the office to establish a Family Justice Center to be eligible for this funding. The District Attorney's Office will use the funds to support staffing and operations of the multidisciplinary Family Justice Center (FJC) to provide co-located services for victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and child and elder abuse. Funds will support a part-time limited term FJC Coordinator to manage the center, provide intake and administration, and provide requisite training.
