**SUBJECT:** Resolution approving execution of Amendment #1 to the

Contract with Integrated Psychiatric Solutions, Inc. for the provision of mental health services, to increase the maximum contract price from \$45,000 to \$65,000 (an increase of \$20,000) and revise Exhibit "B", Schedule of Charges and Payments to reflect the increase in the maximum contract price for the term of

July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. (PESP4362)

**RECOMMENDATION:** Approve the attached Resolution.

**FUNDING:** These are court ordered, non-optional services and are funded with Child Welfare Allocation funds which consist of Federal Title IV-B, Title XIX, and Department realignment funds. Services are within the Department's FY 2021/22 and there are no county general fund dollars required in the Agreement.

BACKGROUND: On September 16, 2021, per Purchasing Order PESP4362, the Nevada County Purchasing Agent approved execution of the Professional Services Contract with Integrated Psychiatric Solutions, Inc. for the provision of mental services for Child Welfare Services (CWS) children and families that target well-being. Psychiatric Solutions, Inc. specializes in child, adolescent, and adult psychiatry. They help bring resolution to the mental health struggles clients are facing and are trained in a variety of therapeutic interventions.

It is recommended that the Board approve this Amendment #1 to the contract, as the need for mental health services has increased and is vital to the well-being of CWS children and families.
