SUBJECT: Resolution approving execution of Amendment #1 to the renewal contract with Community Recovery Resources (CoRR) for the provision of Perinatal Outpatient Drug Free Treatment (ODF) and Intensive Outpatient Treatment (IOT) Services for substance using pregnant and/or parenting women; Comprehensive Residential Treatment Program Services for the recovery of alcohol/drug dependency; and Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Services, to residents of Nevada County to increase the maximum contract price from \$589,950 to \$689,950 (an increase of \$100,000) for Fiscal Year 2016/17 and authorize and direct the Auditor-Controller to amend the Behavioral Health Department's Budget for Fiscal Year 2016/17 (4/5 Vote Required).

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the attached Resolution.

FUNDING: Contract services are supported by: Federal SAPT (Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment) Block Grant funds; 2011 Realignment; Court generated Statham funds; Drug Medi-Cal Federal reimbursement; Supportive and Therapeutic Options Program (STOP) funds and funds made available from the Probation Department. The increase to this contract is for Probation Referred Clients and will be reimbursed to Behavioral Health by the Probation Department. A budget amendment is included and requires a 4/5 vote by the Board Members. There are no county general fund dollars required in the contract.

BACKGROUND: The Board of Supervisors approved this renewal contract with CoRR on September 13, 2016 per Resolution No. 16-440 for services related to substance abuse prevention and treatment for Nevada County residents. The contract includes components for Perinatal Outpatient Drug Free Treatment (ODF) and Intensive Outpatient Treatment (IOT) Services for substance using pregnant and/or parenting women; Comprehensive Residential Treatment Program Services for the recovery of alcohol/drug dependency; and Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Services, to residents of Nevada County.

The Amendment before you today increases the budget for Probation Referred Clients from \$100,000 to \$200,000 to accommodate probationers' higher than anticipated need for treatment and transitional housing services; thereby, increasing the maximum contract price from \$589,950 to \$689,950.

In bringing together a program of substance abuse treatment, mental health and social services expertise, with health professionals, these contracted services provide a cohesive system for intervention, assessment, treatment and recovery that enhances the well-being of individuals and families which helps to achieve and maintain sober, clean, healthy, rewarding lifestyles and to end repeated cycles of substance abuse addiction.
