At the March 10, 2017 meeting of the Nevada County Historical Landmarks Commission, the Commission voted unanimously to recommend to the Board that the application for landmark designation of the building at 309 Broad Street in Nevada City, now operating as the Golden Era lounge, be approved and the building designated as Nevada County Historical Landmark NEV 17-01.

The building has served as a saloon, bar or restaurant since the Gold Rush Era. It is first recorded in 1861 as the Café National. It has a number of interesting interior features, such as a ceiling rotunda used to ventilate smoke, which are detailed in the enclosed application.

The present property owners, who have carefully renovated the building, are the applicants. They support the historical designation of this property and have provided a thorough level of research and documentation to accompany their application, which has been reviewed by the Commission for historical accuracy. The application and supporting documentation is enclosed.

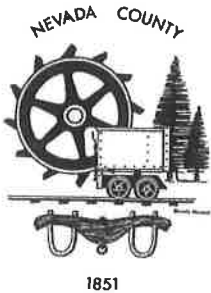

Unique Aspects or Properties of Proposed Landmark

Site has served as a Saloon / Bar since the Gold Rush era. 1st recorded evidence is 1861 as Café National. Chronology of Bar history attached as recorded in Searls & Nevada City Historic Libraries.

Saloon: 1861 – 1918

Soda Fountain: 1919 – 1933 (Prohibition). Evidence of back room liquor sales during same period (Journal).

Saloon: 1933 – 1983

Restaurant / Bar: 1983 – 2013

Bar: 2015 - present

Unique Historic Aspects:

1. Basement with ice block chute into ice storage vault. Used to store ice from cuts from Norden area lakes & icehouses.
2. Original saloon front doors

Welcome to Golden Era. Cocktails & Spirits have been served here since the gold rush days. This building was constructed in 1867 following the destruction of earlier buildings from fires that ravaged Nevada City in the early days. Below is a chronology of the venues that called 309 Broad Street home since 1861.

- 1861 Cafe National
- 1870 Stumpf's Miner's Hotel & Restaurant
- 1901 Eilerman Saloon
- 1906 W. B. Celio Purchased the Property
- 1910 Costello & Jepson Saloon (leased from Celio)
(First Journal Entry by Costello October 21, 1911)
- 1920 Costello & Jepson Soda Fountain (Prohibition era)
- 1930 Muscardini & Costa Soda Fountain
- 1940 Club Pool Hall
- 1945 The Success
- 1976 Duffy's Success
- 1983 Cirino's
- 2015 Golden Era

The Brunswick-Balke-Collender front bar (circa 1890) arrived in Nevada City in 1901 and was originally housed on Commercial Street. In 1904 this front bar was moved to its current location at Golden Era and has remained there since. Note the bar rail where "belly up to the bar" originated. Patrons could tie their belt on and stay for a while!

The Brunswick-Balke-Collender, "The Record" back bar (built circa 1895), traveled from Chicago by ship around the horn, to San Francisco, (Polk Street at the Thomas Cafe). Sherm Costello & Hans Jepsen purchased the bar for \$455, March 12, 1915.

The National Cash Register on the back bar is a 1902 model and was found in our area after its retirement decades ago.

Take a moment to visit the "Golden Era" original oil painting depicting the golden history of our region. The artist Lorene Adams of San Francisco, was commissioned in 1980 to capture the history of our region from the discovery of gold through today and our new "Golden Era".

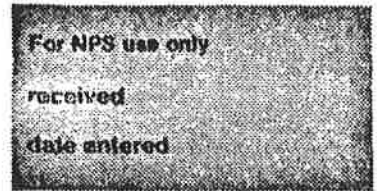

B-23 309 Broad Street Built: Circa 1890
 Cirino's

This one-story frame building has a large window on each side of the double doors. Recessed wood panels framed with molding are on each side of the windows and in each end of the recessed store front. Similar smaller panels are beneath each window. The steep gable has overhanging eaves and an elaborate example of tooled-wood gable trim just below the ridge beam.

B-24 312 - 312½ Broad Street Built: 1913
 Merrill's Real Estate Architect: Oscar Brown

This two-story reinforced concrete building was designed along the lines of the Union Building, 301 Broad Street. The facade has plate-glass front with six small row windows above, topped by a wide wood lintel. The extreme ends at street level and the entire second story are faced with white glazed brick, rising to a pressed-iron ornamental corbeled cornice. The two pair of sash windows in the second story are topped by a drip board. The entrance to the ground floor, basement, and upper story is through a tiled lobby with curved glass similar to that leading into the entrance of the Union Building. Behind the building is a storage area with modern double garage and wide driveway onto Commercial Street.

B-27 313 Broad Street Built: Circa 1879
 Antique Emporium

This one-story frame building has a recessed entry. The door is a long glass panel above a small wood panel. Glass on both sides of the door extend to the ends of the building. The wood gable has a shuttered window in the center. Behind the building is parking space and driveway to Spring Street

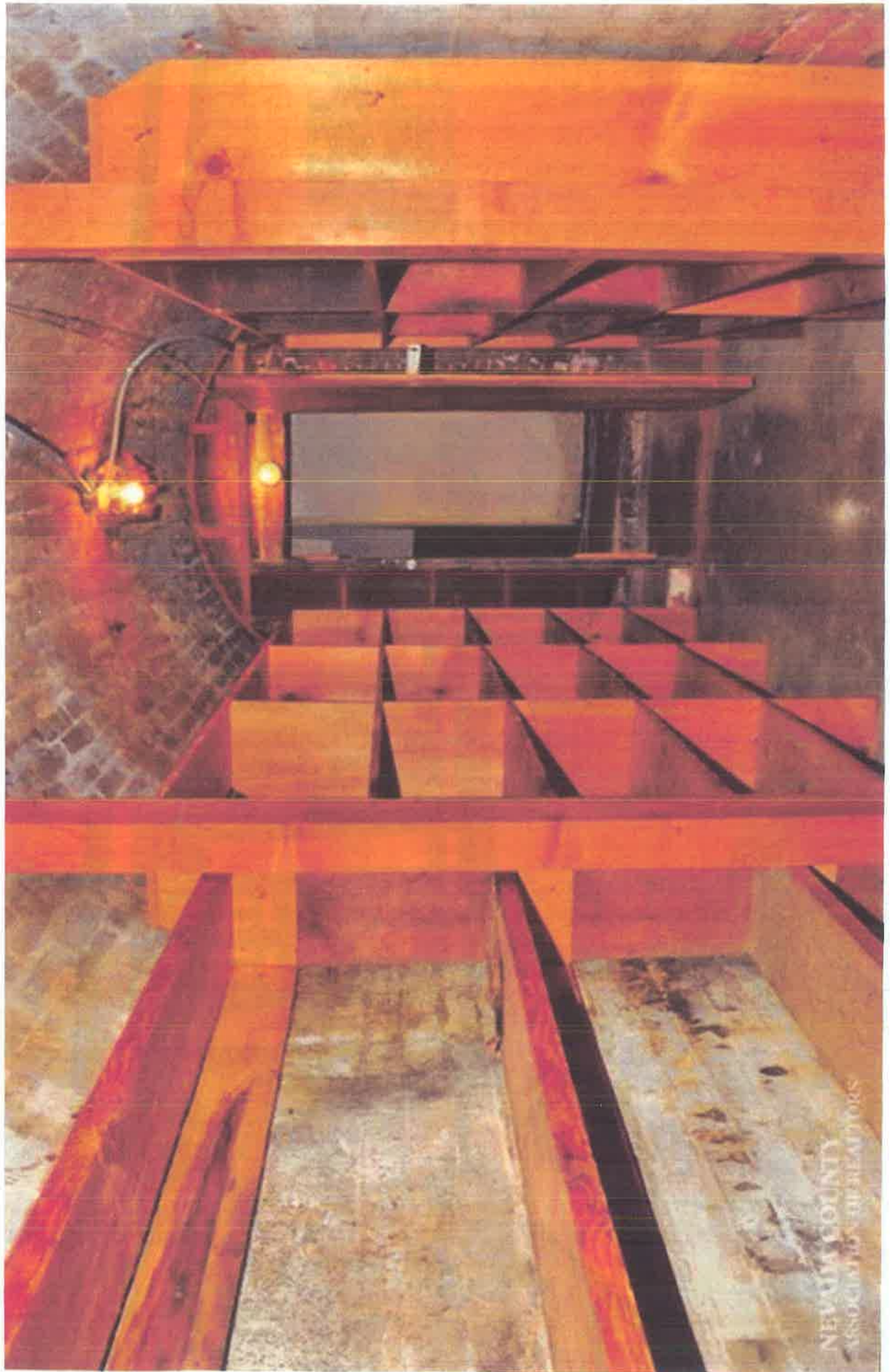
B-29 315 Broad Street Built: Circa 1880
 McGee's

This two-story brick building houses a saloon at street level with an apartment above. The facade is stucco, and the large 48-light window was installed in 1983. The second-story balustraded veranda is supported by three ornamental turned posts and brackets and covers the sidewalk below. This veranda added after 1965, replaces a plainer one that shows in old photographs, which may be viewed inside the saloon. At the present time a restaurant and upstairs apartment are being constructed on the rear of the building, where there is also a small parking area and an entrance onto Spring Street.

B-30 318 Broad Street Built: Circa 1881
 Posh-Nosh

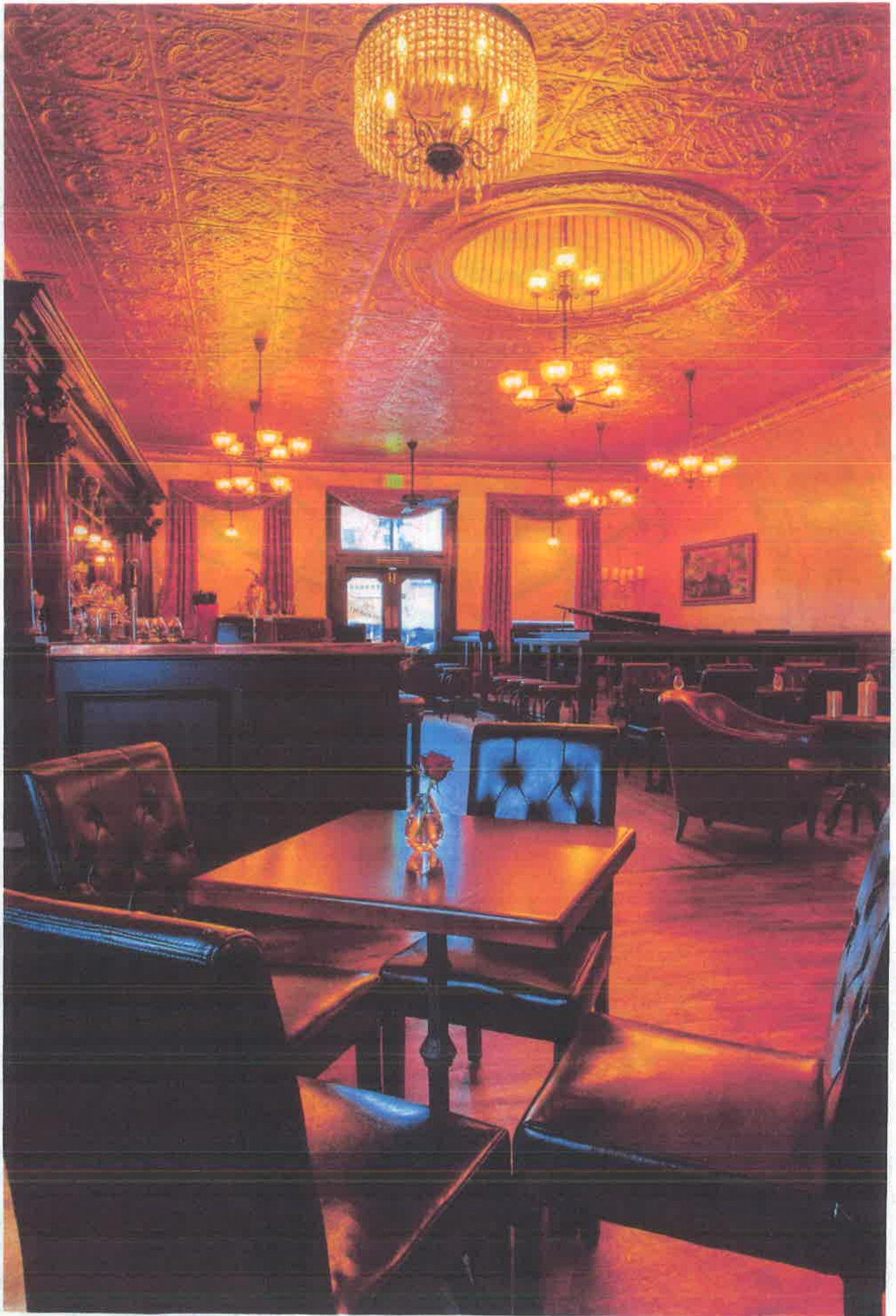
This one-story brick building was restored in 1965 according to an 1884 photograph. The tall, narrow, recessed windows were originally doors. The brick columns on each

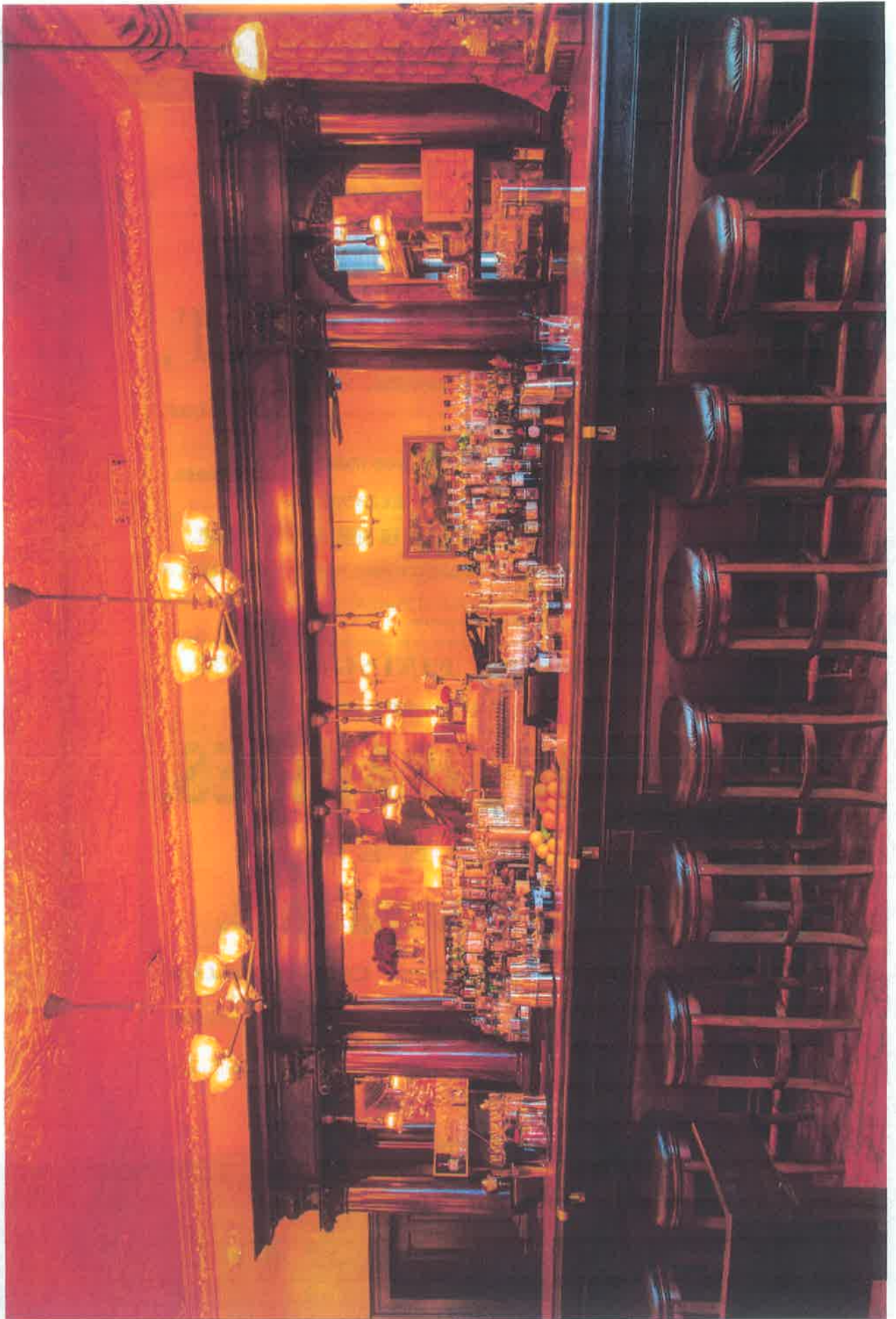

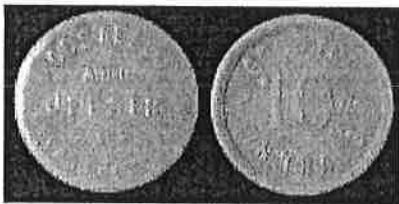

AS BABE TELLS IT

The oil producing countries, already bulging with overflowing profits, from the sale of their oil, is now contemplating a new raise in the prices to the importing countries. Here we go again. With a string of these possibilities apparent, the United States is feverishly planning to purchase oil and store it in the caverns around the country in order to avert another shortage in case of a shut off. After the program gets serious and the caverns are full and if pressure is applied by the oil producers, the stored oil will only supply the country for six months. It's like chasing a rainbow. The Alaska pipeline will give us some hope, although it does not solve our problems. In the long run, our own supply, still undeveloped, must be utilized. But there it sits while the American consumer takes it in the neck. Our coal supplies are so abundant that it would take 500 years to exhaust. We are all interested in the history of our town, especially those buildings now housing going business's. We recently learned of a little of the background of Duffy's Success, now owned by James Morales. In 1856 the land was bare, the building having been destroyed by fire. In 1861 it was known as the Cafe National. In 1870 and for several years following, it was known as the Miners Hotel and Restaurant. In 1902 it became a saloon and remained so until today. In 1901 it was known as the Eilerman Saloon and later sold to W.B. Celio who leased it to Kindrich, Costello, Jepson, and others. It was leased to the Legendary Frank Duffy who in turn sold to the present owner. The ornate back bar originally came from San Francisco in the late 1890's and was housed in a business on Commercial Street before it found its present home in 1904.

Many of the Redwood trees of California are known to be from two to three thousand years of age, while the Mexican cypress lives even longer and there is one found in the village of Santa Maria De Tule which is four thousand years old and the most ancient living thing in the world.

It is interesting to realize that with every new idea, someone, somewhere will find a way to use it in another way. The latest ripoff is coming from the small round push tab now showing up on beverages. This innovation came about in order to replace the dangerous pull tab on soft drinks and beer cans. Now someone has found a use for the dime size

aluminum push tab. They cut the can, free the tab and behold, it serves as a dime in a parking meter. Two hours of free parking. Another headache for the police and local government.

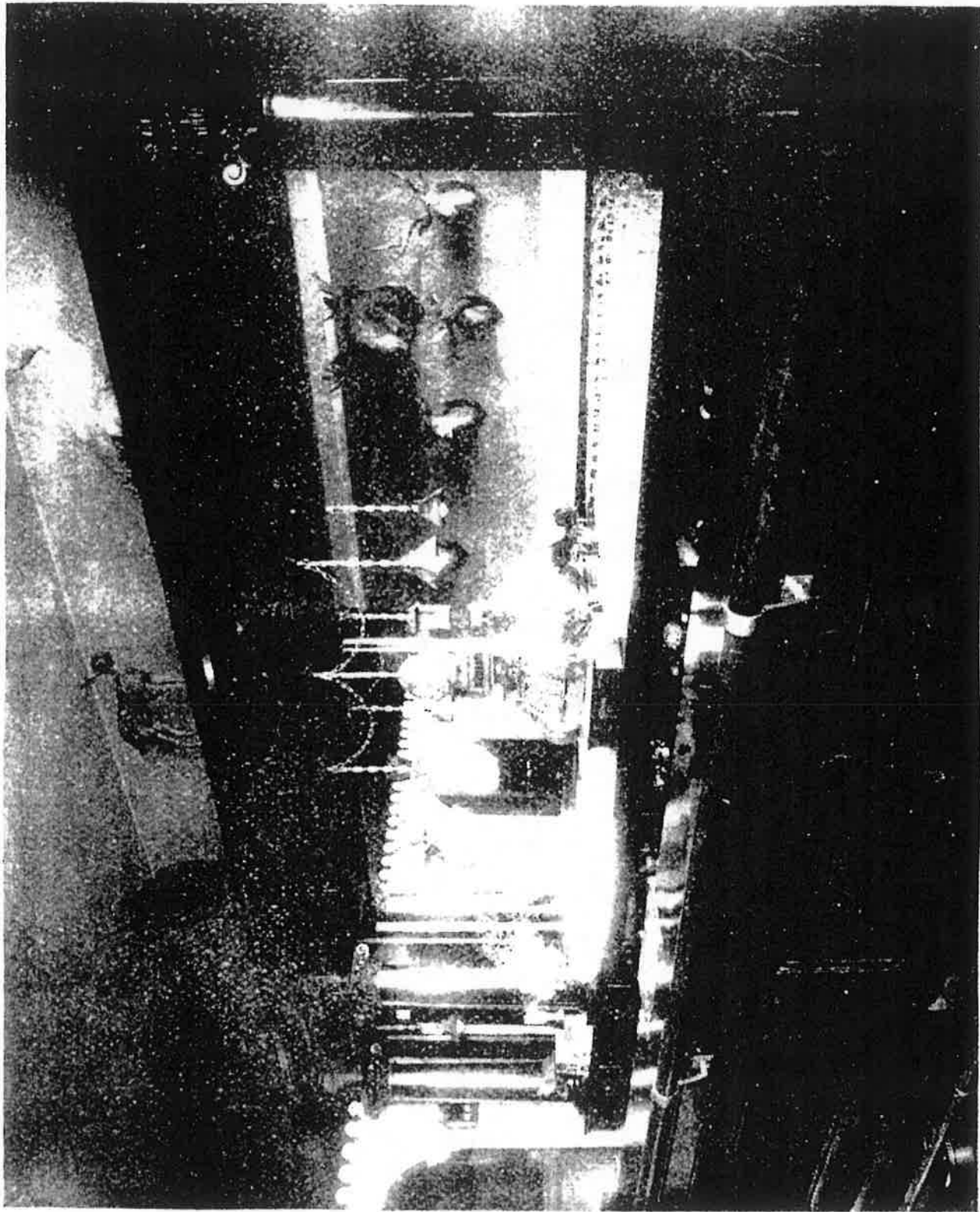

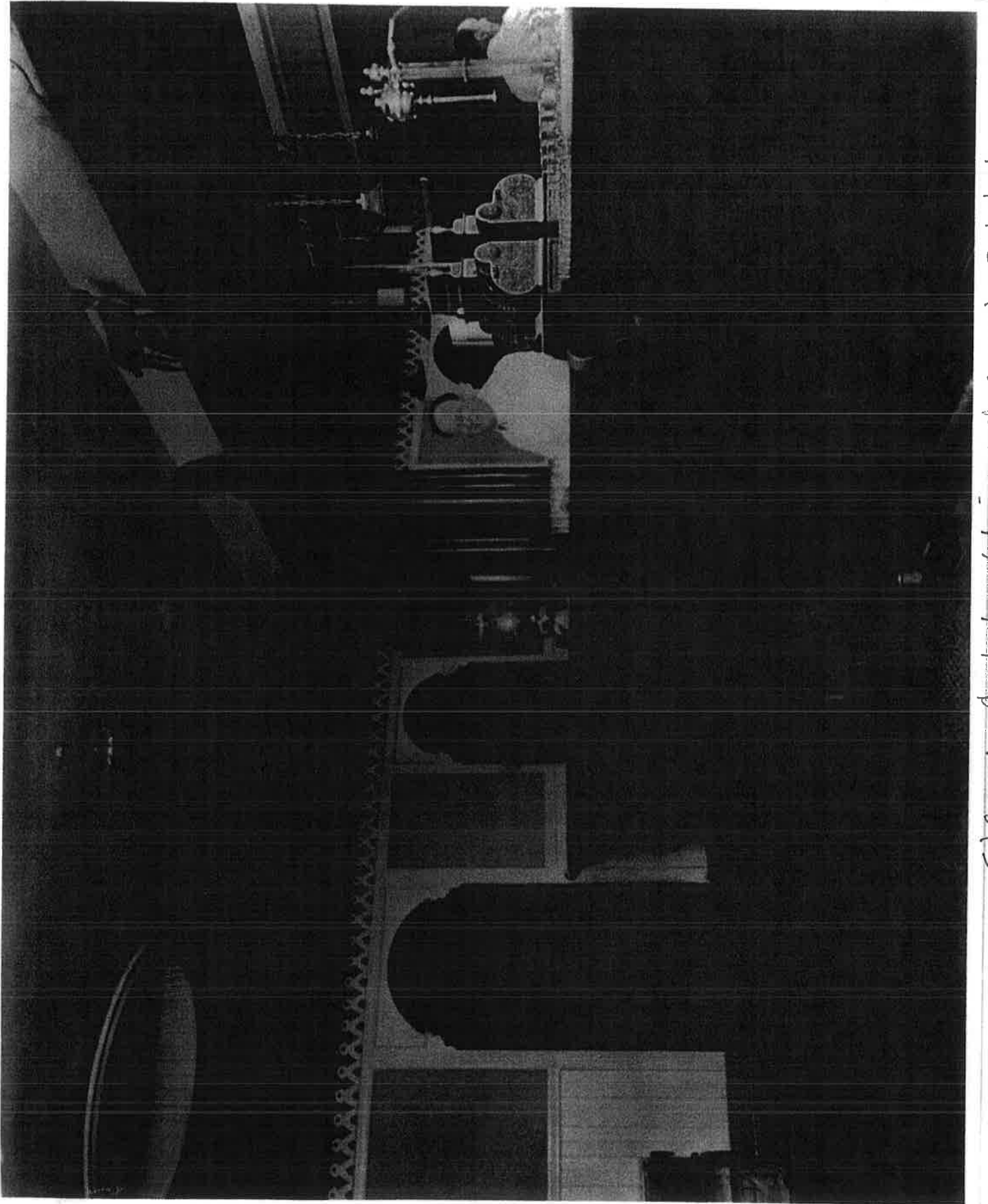
