SUBJECT: Resolution approving an Operational Agreement between the Nevada County District Attorney's Office and Community Beyond Violence with an annual amount not to exceed \$10,000.00 for the period of July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2029, and authorizing the District Attorney to execute the agreement.

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt the Resolution requesting authorization for a four-year agreement between the Nevada County District Attorney's Office and Community Beyond Violence, not to exceed \$10,000.00 annually.

FUNDING:

Funds are collected from the marriage license domestic violence surcharge fee collected pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code section 18305 and court fees pursuant to Penal Code section 1203.097. They are deposited into a domestic violence special fund, 1153. These funds are disbursed pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code section 18305 and Penal Code section 1203.097. No General Fund monies are used.

BACKGROUND:

The Community Beyond Violence (CBV), formerly known as Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Coalition, are a comprehensive service provider in western Nevada County including a 24-hour crisis line, transportation, emergency food and clothing, emergency safe housing and shelters, counseling, accompaniment and advocacy, information and referral services, a drop-in center, education and outreach programs. The services provided also help school age children continue their education during their stay at the shelter program. The objective is to provide immediate crisis intervention and other comprehensive services for all victims of domestic crime. The program strives for complete restoration of the victim's dignity, health and resources.

CBV provides the District Attorney's Office with annual reports detailing the numbers of new victims each year and the number of crisis calls through the 24-hour hotline. Much of their funding is through state and federal grants.

The District Attorney's Office retains an 8% administrative fee to manage the funds as outlined in Penal Code Section 1203.097 (B).
