SUBJECT: Resolution approving execution of a renewal contract with Yuba Harm Reduction Collective for provision of professional services to prevent opioid overdoses, support recovery and ensure access to quality care for vulnerable populations in the maximum amount of \$75,000 for the contract term of July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2027.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the attached Resolution.

FUNDING: This contract is supported by the Opioid Litigation Settlement funds received through HHSA Admin. Settlement funds must be dedicated to activities that directly address the opioid crisis, including opioid use prevention activities such as naloxone distribution, increasing access to treatment and recovery supports, and services for populations disproportionately impacted by the opioid crisis. These funds were anticipated and included in the Department's FY 26/27 budget. No General Fund dollars are included.

BACKGROUND: This contract is renewal and expansion of past contracts with Yuba Harm Reduction Collective for a range of opioid use prevention activities, including naloxone distribution, rapid opioid overdose response and coordination, and increasing access to treatment and recovery supports. In addition, the contract continues to support the administration of Nevada County Public Health's health supply vending machine program through health supply kit making, restocking and maintenance. The contract also includes services related to the development of a support group for people living with HIV/AIDS and their loved ones in Nevada County.

This contract will support the county's efforts to decrease opioid overdose deaths, increase access to treatment and recovery support, and provide important services to some of the county's most vulnerable residents.
