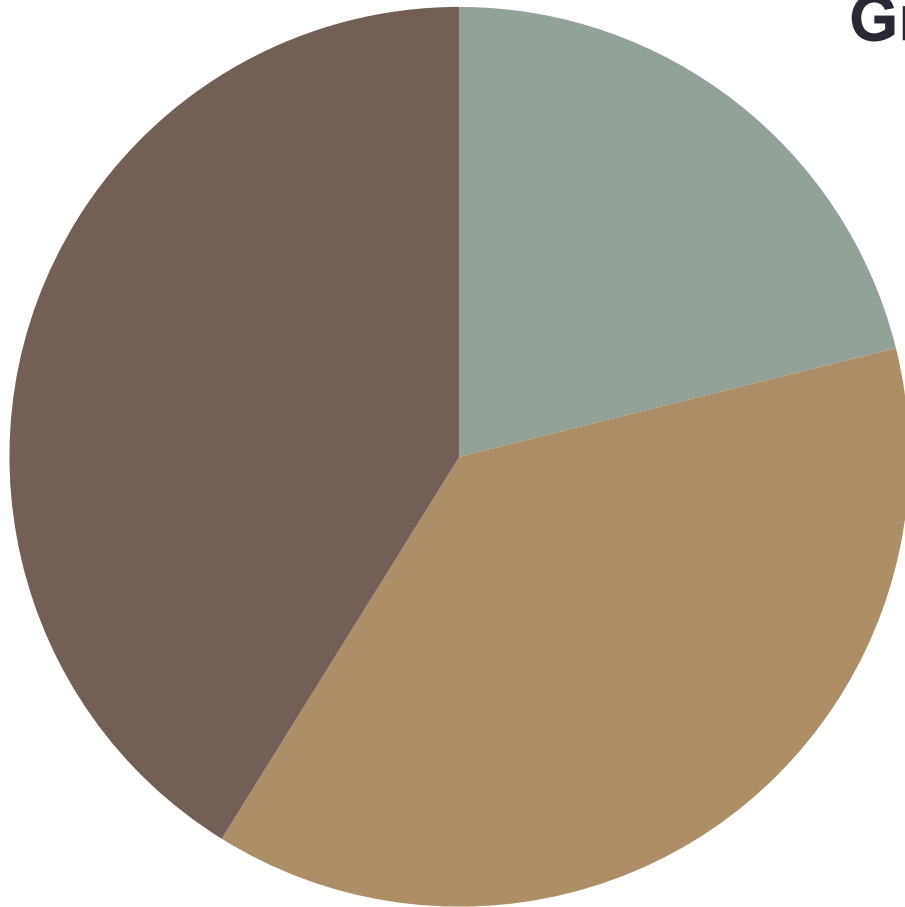


NEW GRANTS

Improving mental health and substance use services for high priority populations

Significant New Funding

Grants Total \$592,019



- Medication Assisted Therapy in Jails \$125,000
- Rural Health Opioid Prevention \$223,450
- Justice and Mental Health Collaboration \$243,569

Medication Assisted Therapy in Jails Grant

Goal: increase understanding of MAT as a best practice for substance use disorder and increase usage of MAT within jails

- State funded
- Initial grant of \$25,000 but promise of an additional \$100,000
- Learning collaborative – coaching and training in best practices

Rural Health Opioid Prevention Grant

Goal: Decrease incidence of opioid overdoses through increased access to treatment and prevention

- Health Resources and Services Administration funded
- Total grant: \$223,450 over three years
- Focus on most vulnerable people struggling with addiction

Justice and Mental Health Collaboration Grant

Goal: Increase identification and treatment of people in jail with mental illness

- Funded by Department of Justice
- Total Grant: \$243,569 over two years
- Focus on unidentified and untreated inmates

Key themes of three grants:

- Similar population focus
 - People who are homeless, chronic criminal justice involvement
- Collaboration between key partners
 - Sheriff, District Attorney, CFMG, Public Defender, Probation, Public Health
- Partnership with community based non-profits
 - CORR, Hospital, Hospitality House and others
- All support Board Priorities:
 - Address factors contributing to Homelessness
 - Address goals of Stepping Up Initiative
