ROLE OF AN EMS AGENCY

An EMS Agency has a statutory obligation to ensure the best possible care to the patient in the pre-hospital setting. This is accomplished by:

- Establishing policy and treatment protocols utilizing a committee process to ensure input
- Ensuring licensed and certified personnel are familiar with the system in which they operate and meet education and background requirements

- Establishing response times to ensure that the patient receives the closest most appropriate resource and is transported to the most appropriate facility
- Ensuring member counties have input in process by establishing and attending meetings to discuss system improvements and concerns
- Designating specialty centers and requiring committee/peer review
- Conducting annual ambulance inspections to ensure medications are current and adequate supplies are stocked
- S-SV staff ride-along in ambulances and with fire personnel to ensure Agency familiarization with the system

FUNDING

Our Agency's funding comes from

- County contributions (.42 cents per capita +\$10,000 base rate);
- State General Fund augmentation (available to Regional EMS Agencies only);
- Fees – certification, trauma center, training programs
- As a public agency we have OPEB obligations. Our unfunded liability is fully paid.

Exclusive Operating Areas

- Nevada County has three areas that are designated as exclusive operating areas, per statute.
- Penn Valley Fire Protection District
- Sierra Nevada Ambulance
- Truckee Fire Protection District at Donner Summit
