

# RESOLUTION No. 18-111

#### OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NEVADA

RESOLUTION APPROVING ACCEPTANCE OF AN ALLOCATION FROM THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES WHICH PROVIDES FUNDING FOR THE EMERGENCY CHILD CARE BRIDGE PROGRAM FOR FOSTER CHILDREN AND AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE AUDITOR-CONTROLLER TO AMEND THE SOCIAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT'S BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017-2018 (4/5 AFFIRMATIVE VOTE REQUIRED)

WHEREAS, the California Department of Social Services is providing an allocation to counties which provides funding for the Emergency Child Care Bridge Program for Foster Children (Bridge Program); and

WHEREAS, the goal of the Bridge Program is to increase the number of foster children successfully placed in home-based family care settings; and

WHEREAS, the Bridge Program has three components: Emergency Child Care Voucher, Child Care Navigator, and Trauma-informed Care Training and Coaching; and

WHEREAS, one of the primary barriers for potential families seeking to take in a foster child is the lack of access to child care immediately following the removal of the child; and


WHEREAS, the funding will support all three of the components of the Bridge Program which will enable families to receive a voucher to help with child care to help decrease the barriers for placement of foster children, and a child care navigator to provide trauma-informed care training and coaching.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Nevada, State of California, that the allocation from the California Department of Social Services which provides funding for the Emergency Child Care Bridge Program for Foster Children for the term of January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018, in the maximum amount of \$33,463 be and hereby is approved in substantially the form hereto attached.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Nevada County Board of Supervisors authorizes and directs the Auditor-Controller to amend the Social Services Department's Budget for Fiscal Year 2017/18 as follows:

This letter informs counties of the Fiscal Year 2017-18 allocation for the Emergency Child Care Bridge Program for Foster Children (Bridge Program). A total of \$15.3 million General Fund (GF) is available based on the Budget Act of 2017, as shown in the attachment.

The Bridge Program is comprised of three main components: the emergency child care vouchers, the child care navigator, and trauma-informed care training. Funds were distributed for these three components in the following manner:

- Emergency child care voucher \$11.0 million GF
- Child care navigator \$2.5 million GF
- Trauma-informed care training \$1.75 million GF

#### **Emergency Child Care Voucher - Assistance**

A total of \$11.0 million GF for emergency child care vouchers was distributed using each county's percentage of the total statewide allocation based on eligible caseload multiplied by the Regional Market Rate for the appropriate category (Infant, Preschool and School Age). The caseload is based on children aged zero to twelve in relative. nonrelative extended family member, and foster family home and foster family agency placements, including those placements approved as Resource Families taken from the California Child Welfare Indicators Project as of April 1, 2017. A minimum floor based

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on caseload size categories was incorporated to ensure that counties receive no less than the following minimum allocations:

Very small: \$10,000Small: \$20,000Medium: \$50,000Large: \$100,000

#### Child Care Navigator and Trauma-Informed Care Training - Administration

A total of \$2.5 million GF for the child care navigator component and \$1.75 million GF for trauma-informed care training was distributed using the same methodology as the Emergency Child Care Voucher component, by determining each county's percentage of the statewide total eligible caseload. A minimum floor was incorporated to ensure that counties receive a minimum allocation of no less than \$2,500 for the child care navigator component and \$1,000 for trauma-informed care training.

A final list of counties that did not opt into the Bridge Program was received and the amounts originally allocated to these counties in <u>ACL No. 17-109</u> were redistributed to participating counties based on each county's percentage of the total original allocation for participating counties.
