SUBJECT: Resolution approving execution of Amendment #1 to the Community

Services Block Grant (CSBG) funded Contract with Hospitality House, increasing the maximum amount from \$28,356 to \$43,356 (an increase of \$15,000) for the term of July 1, 2018 through December 31, 2019, related to

providing low income homeless members of the community with

transportation to connect with mainstream benefits.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the attached Resolution.

<u>FUNDING</u>: Contract services are supported by available 2019 Federal Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) funding awarded to the County to support the priorities of County's approved Community Action Plan (CAP). There are no County General Fund dollars required in the Agreement.

BACKGROUND: Per Resolution No. 17-273, the Board of Supervisors approved the 2018/19 Nevada County Community Action Plan and authorized its submittal to the State Department of Community Services and Development (CSD). The County was subsequently awarded funds via the State CSBG funding Agreement.

The County, in conjunction with the Adult and Family Services Commission (AFSC), issued a Request for Funding (RFF) for Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) dollars to provide funding for community projects which support low income members of the community as identified in the CAP.

On June 26, 2018, Per Resolution 18-288, the Board of Supervisors approved the AFSC recommendation to award funding to provide transportation to homeless and other low income members of the community in order to gain access to mainstream benefits. Hospitality House through their Homeless Access Transport (HAT) program provides low income homeless individuals in the community with access to mainstream benefits by supplying transportation in order to gain assistance

from agencies such as Social Services, Mental Health, food banks, Public Health, etc. HAT also provides support to those seeking housing assistance. In the HAT program's first six months, transportation was made available to 501 individuals and assisted in providing 85 individuals with emergency transportation.

In response to the availability of additional CSBG funding, the Parties desire to enter into this Amendment #1 to increase the maximum amount from \$28,356 to \$43,356 (an increase of \$15,000), as set forth in the revised Exhibit "B" Schedule of Charges and Payments, for the term of July 1, 2018 through December 31, 2019. It is recommended that the Board approve this Amendment #1, as it will further support access to mainstream benefits for homeless and other low income members of the community that otherwise would continue to struggle to obtain services that provide for their basic needs.
