

At the January 2020 and 2022 Board Workshops, the Board directed staff to engage stakeholders and residents in a needs assessment and identify a sustainable funding strategy.





The CEO Roundtable Needs Assessment process

Staff consulted with key county, municipal, and first responder stakeholders:

- Town of Truckee
- Truckee Fire Protection District
- Sheriff's Office
- CAL FIRE
- Consolidated Fire District
- City of Grass Valley
- City of Nevada City
- Community Development Agency
- Health and Human Services Agency
- Office of Emergency Services
- Community leaders

And received 62 projects and program ideas totaling \$36,000,000 per year.





The CEO Roundtable:

Developed a **draft expenditure plan** responsive to community priorities and based on an estimated \$12 Million in annual revenue from a ½ cent general sales tax.


Developed guiding principles, notably Accountability, Transparency, and Regional Equity.

The CEO Roundtable recommended target allocations to protect the community

Regional Equity:

Measure V would provide for regional equity between Western and Eastern County in recognition of each region's unique public safety needs.

"East County" is defined as longitudinally east of the I-80/Hwy 20 junction.



The MOU:

- First responders helped draft the plan
- Memorialized agreements
- 10-year "sunset"
- 25% investment in Eastern County (\$3,000,000)
 - 8.33% to Town of Truckee (\$1,000,000)
 - 16.67% to Eastern County (\$2,000,000)



Use of Measure V funds

- Town Priorities in the categories of Planning, Mitigation, Response, Recovery
- Aligned with local and regional plans
- Expand and enhance Measure T programs
- Coordinated project development, grant writing, and advocacy
- Countywide coordination on shared programs like planning and emergency communications

Measure V provides sustainable funding to take on large-scale projects. Eastern Nevada County has identified 8 critical fuel breaks totaling 9,350 acres What else can be accomplished together?

> The estimated cost to implement this work is ~\$28 million. More to maintain it in perpetuity.

Accountability and Transparency

- Measure V revenue and expenses would be recorded in separate accounts distinct from other County funds and subject to annual independent audits.
- A Technical Advisory Committee would recommend funding priorities to the Board for approval as part of the County's annual budget process.
- The Board-appointed Citizens Oversight Committee would report annually to the public on the receipt and expenditures of Measure V funds.
- The County would have a dedicated webpage to post contracting opportunities, awarded contracts, and annual audited reports to ensure maximum transparency.


The Eastern County Technical Advisory Committee (ETAC)...

Develops independent recommendations for the annual expenditure plan.

Is supported by County OES staff.

The Eastern TAC

- Town Manager
- Fire Chief
- 5 local community volunteer experts
 (2 from Town + 3 from the unincorporated county)



The Citizen Oversight Committee (COC)...

Annual Reports to Public:

- Sales tax collected
- How money is used
- Findings of regular audits
- Posted on public "dashboard"

Ensures transparency and accountability.

Board Appoints 7 Members: Supervisor appoints 1 from District Board appoints 2 at-large RE
