SUBJECT: Resolution approving a Professional Services Contract between

the County of Nevada and Gold Country Community Services dba Gold Country Senior Services in the amount of \$600,000 for services related to the California Strategic Growth Council's Community Resilience Centers Program, delegating authority to the Director of Facilities, or designee, to execute the contract and related documents, and directing the Auditor-Controller to

encumber the funds and amend the FY 2025/26 Capital

Facilities Budget (4/5 affirmative vote required).

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt the Resolution

FUNDING: All costs associated with this contract will be funded through the Community Resilience Centers (CRC) grant awarded by the California Strategic Growth Council. There is no General Fund impact associated with this item. A budget amendment is required and is included in this resolution.

BACKGROUND: In April 2025, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution 25-155, accepting a \$10 million grant award from the California Strategic Growth Council under the Community Resilience Centers (CRC) program. This grant supports the revitalization of the Western Nevada County Veterans' Halls and the development of programming and partnerships to enhance community resilience.

On October 14, 2025, the Board adopted Resolution 25-490 approving the CRC Partnership Agreement, which established the Collaborative Stakeholder Structure for the "Revitalizing Western Nevada County Veterans Halls" project. This agreement formalized the roles and responsibilities of nonprofit partners, including Gold Country Community Services (GCSS), in implementing CRC-funded programming.

GCSS was a co-applicant on the CRC Grant and is a key partner in the CRC Collaborative Stakeholder Structure. As part of the CRC grant implementation, GCSS will provide services including:

- Monthly community cooking classes
- Emergency services and response support for seniors
- Outreach and coordination with community partners
- Educational programs on green energy, nutrition, and technology
- Access to commercial kitchen space for small businesses
- Data collection and grant reporting

The proposed Professional Services Contract with GCSS is for a not-to-exceed amount of \$600,000, covering the term from October 28, 2025, through April 25, 2030.
