What is Community Choice Aggregation?


Community Choice Aggregation (CCA) is a program that allows local governments in California to procure power on behalf of their residents, businesses, and municipal accounts from an alternative supplier while still receiving transmission and distribution service from their existing utility provider (PG&E)









Currently 11-member board

Board approved \$2 million of funding for energy efficiency programs


Programs direction given by Community Advisory Committee made up of citizens from our territory Pioneer spent \$1.3 million in the region last year

Pioneer recognized by CPUC for ranking #2 among CCAs in procurement with MWBE certified organizations












Where we can/cannot serve



PG&E Bill – Page #1

- Pioneer listed on the front page
- Customer pays total energy bill to PG&E one payment
- PG&E remits \$ to Pioneer

What happens if I am on solar?

- Pioneer has +30,000 solar accounts
- If you are a net generator, we pay a ½ cent premium over PG&E for your power
- If you are a net consumer, you enjoy the same discount as nonsolar customers
- No contract or PPA required
- Reconcile monthly
- Annual pay-outs
- Indifferent on NEM 1, 2 or 3



Can I stay on PG&E programs?

- Remember: You are a customer of Pioneer AND PG&E
- Any program you are on currently with PG&E, you stay on.
 Examples include but not limited to:
 - ✓ CARE
 - ✓ FERA
 - ✓ Medical Baseline
- Your PG&E service will not be impacted by joining Pioneer (e.g., service request placed last in queue with PG&E because you're with Pioneer)


