SUBJECT: Resolution approving execution of a contract with Bright Futures for Youth for the provision of Californians For All Workforce Development Program, in the maximum amount of \$289,868, for the term of May 19, 2026, through December 31, 2027.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the attached Resolution.

FUNDING: Funding for this agreement is from the Californians For All Youth Service Corps Program and is being approved by the Nevada County Board of Supervisors on May 19, 2026, through a separate resolution. The funding will go through December 31, 2027. There will be no General Funds required.

BACKGROUND: The Youth Workforce Program, or Youth Services Corps (YSC), is a Governor's initiative administered by California Volunteers in partnership with Nevada County and several other municipalities across California. The total amount of the Californians For All Youth Service Corps awarded to Nevada County is \$977,194.12, and Bright Futures for Youth is one of the subcontractors for this program. The purpose of this initiative is to increase youth employment, develop youth interest in and experience towards a career, and strengthen capacity to address key areas of climate, food insecurity, education, and public service. Nevada County's program will recruit, train, and place high-need youth at jobs in a new or existing youth workforce development program. Bright Futures for Youth will employ nine youth over the life of this contract and will provide training and direct supportive services to ensure best outcomes and success for the youth served. Bright Futures for Youth will also work in collaboration with Connecting Point and County partners to ensure youth in both western and eastern county have access to the YSC Program, and assist with warm handoffs to other needed services and support.

It is recommended that the Board approve this contract.
