**STAGE 1:  
Safety and  
preparedness**

Make workplaces  
safe for our  
essential workers.



**STAGE 2:  
Lower-risk  
workplaces**

Gradually reopen  
retail (curbside  
only),  
manufacturing &  
logistics. Later,  
relax retail  
restrictions,  
adapt & reopen  
schools, child  
care, offices &  
limited  
hospitality,  
personal services.



**STAGE 3:  
Higher-risk  
workplaces**

Adapt and reopen  
movie theaters,  
religious services,  
& more  
personal & hospita  
lity services.



**STAGE 4:  
End of Stay  
Home Order**

Reopen areas of  
highest risk: e.g.  
Concerts,  
conventions,  
sports arenas.

# Stage 3: Higher-Risk Workplaces



## Process

1. Phase in higher-risk workplaces, beginning with limited personal care and recreational venues
2. Monitor critical indicators and alter scope of reopening if necessary to protect public health and safety
3. State releases guidance addressing *how* business can reopen
4. Local Health Officer determines *when* businesses can reopen after reviewing epidemiological data
5. NCPHD updates its Reopen Nevada County Plan
6. Businesses reopen after modifications are made

# Stages 2-3: Currently Allowed in Nevada County

Guidance documents posted prior to June 5, 2020

1. General Business, Office
2. Retail
3. Limited Personal Services
4. Manufacturing
5. Restaurants
6. Child Care
7. Places of Worship
8. Hair Salons and Barbershops

# Stages 2-3: New Guidance Documents Posted

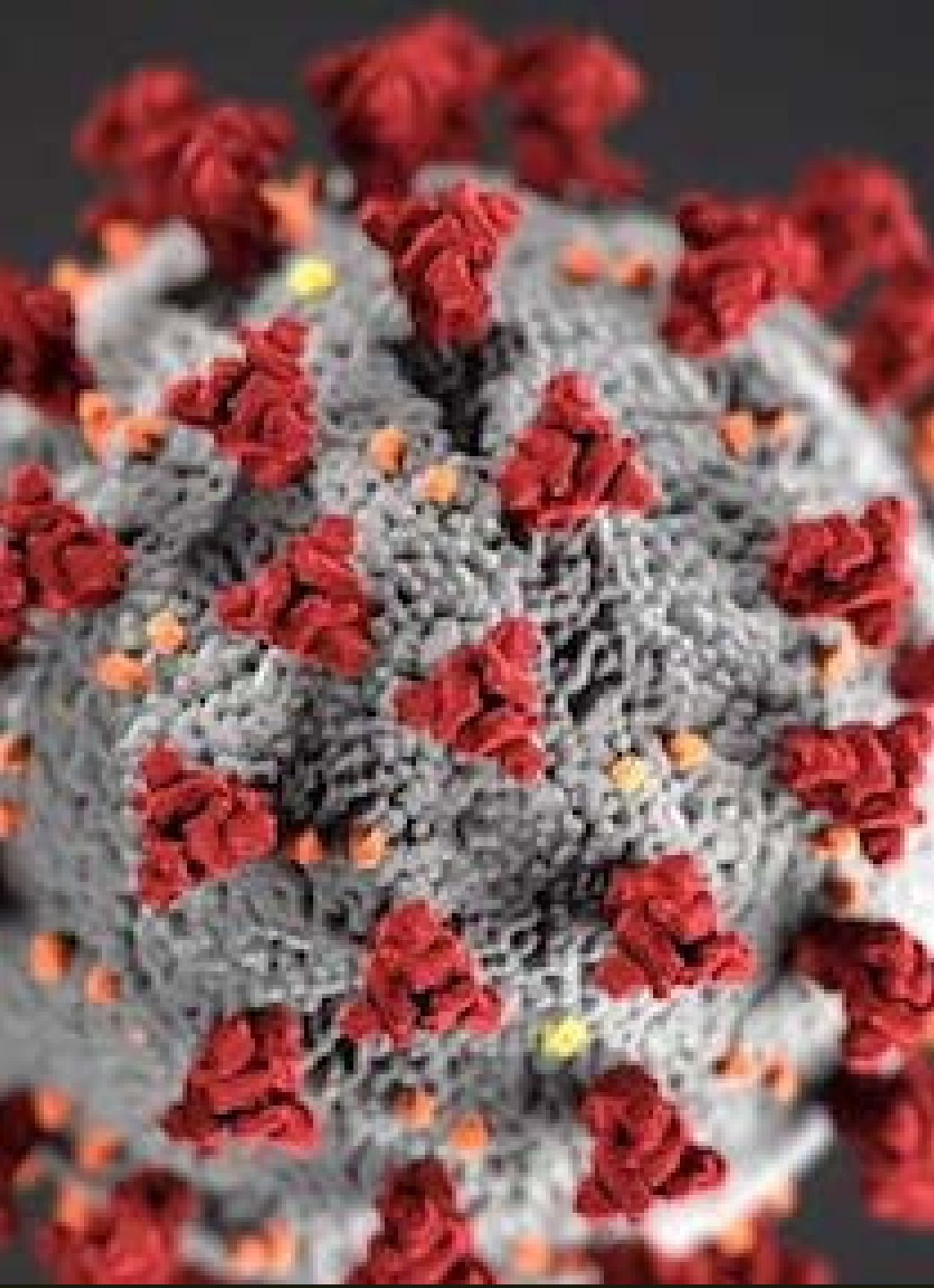
Posted on June 5-8, 2020, and, after review, allowed to reopen on June 12, 2020

1. Day Camps
2. Schools and Daycare (revised)
3. Music, Film and TV Production
4. Professional Sports (without live audiences)
5. Tribal Casinos
6. Movie Theaters and Family Entertainment Centers
7. Wineries and Bars
8. Zoos and Museums
9. Gyms and Fitness Centers
10. Hotels (for tourism)
11. Cardrooms and Racetracks
12. Campgrounds and Outdoor Recreation

# Stage 3: Not Yet Permitted

Sectors, businesses and services not allowed at this time in the State of California:

1. Personal services such as nail salons, tattoo parlors, body waxing
2. Indoor playgrounds such as bounce centers, ball pits and laser tag
3. Live theater
4. Saunas and steam rooms
5. Nightclubs
6. Concert venues
7. Festivals
8. Theme parks
9. Higher education

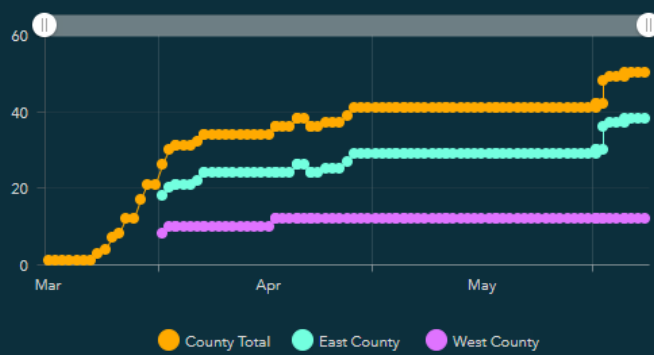

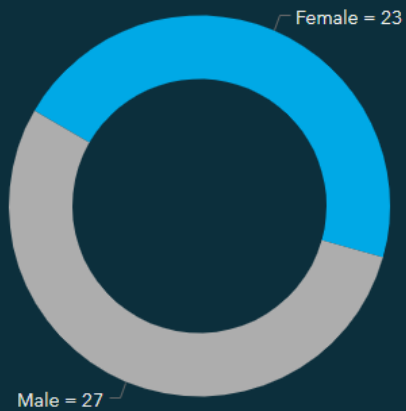
Cases by Mode of Transmission



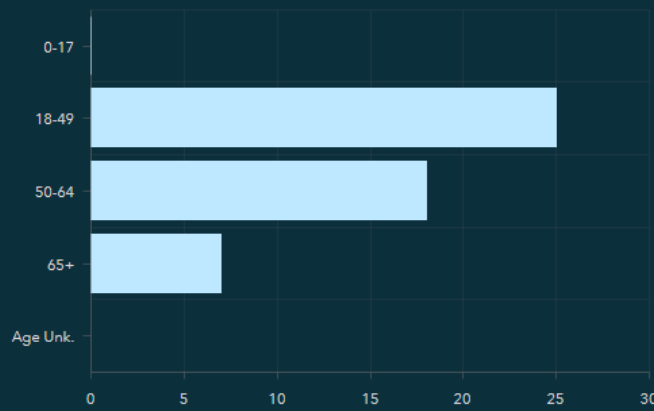
Total Confirmed Cases Over Time



Cases by Gender

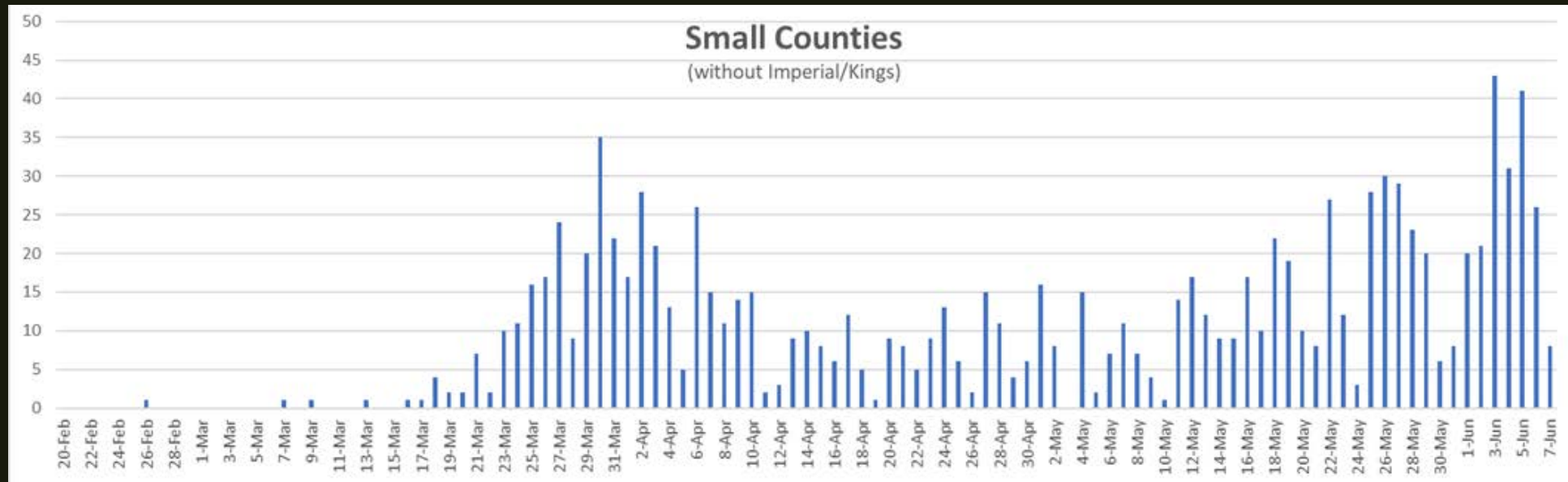


Cases by Age

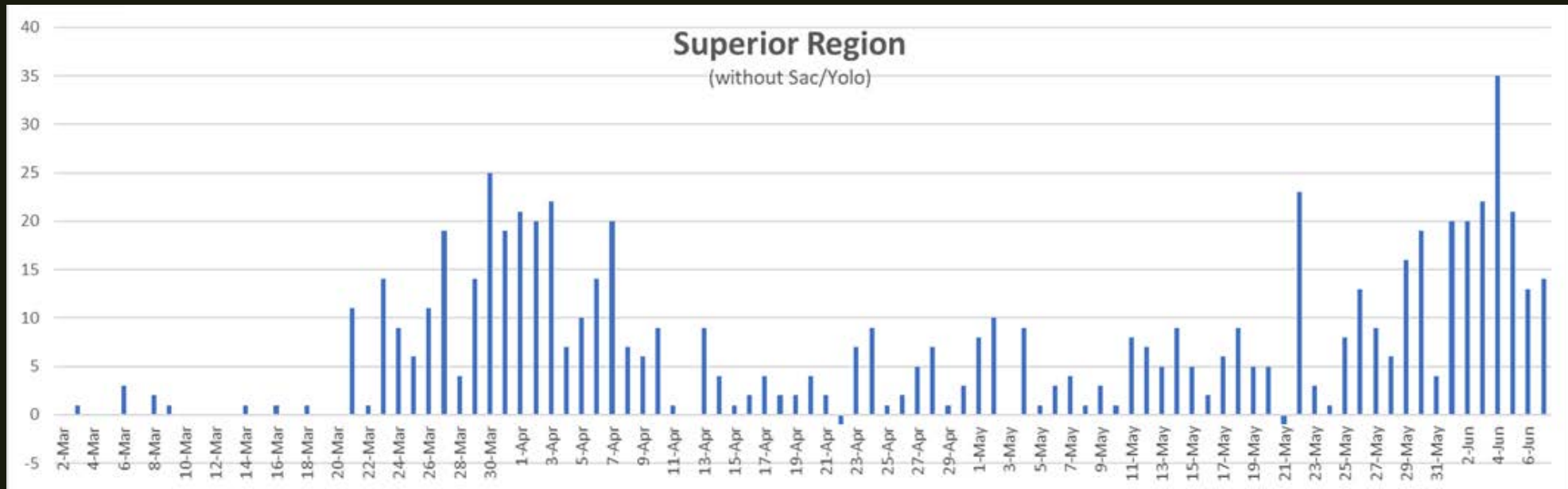

# Back to Basics

- ✓ Physical/social distancing – 6 ft.
- ✓ Hand washing – 20 seconds
- ✓ Face coverings when in public and likely to encounter others
- ✓ Get rest and maintain a healthy lifestyle to keep your immune system strong
- ✓ Stay home when you are sick
- ✓ Patronize businesses that have taken appropriate measures to decrease risk of infection
- ✓ Protect those most susceptible to serious illness
- ✓ Avoid nonessential travel and gatherings



### Myth #1:

“Only the elderly get seriously ill from COVID-19.”

### Reality:

- This is a novel virus and we continue to learn about it
- People of all ages can get seriously ill, including children

### Myth #2:



“Restrictions will end when we have zero cases.”

### Reality:

- Restrictions will end when we have effective therapeutics/treatment or an effective vaccine.
- We don't know yet if herd immunity or community immunity is the answer:
  - *We still don't understand immunity to COVID-19*
  - *Many people would have to be sickened and likely die to achieve community immunity*
