SUBJECT: Resolution approving execution of Amendment No. 1 to the contract with Recover Medical Group P.C. to increase the maximum contract price from \$293,817 to \$440,000 (an increase of \$146,183) and revise Exhibit "B" Schedule of Charges and Payments to reflect the increase in the maximum contract price for the term of July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026. (RES 25-343)

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the attached Resolution.

FUNDING: Funding is provided through a MAT Pilot program funding made available through the Mental Health Services Oversight and Accountability Commission (MHSOAC), Drug Medi-Cal Federal reimbursement and 2011 Realignment. A budget amendment is not needed. There are no County general fund dollars required in the Agreement.

BACKGROUND: On July 8, 2025, per Resolution 25-343, the Nevada County Board of Supervisors approved execution of the Professional Services Contract with Recover Medical Group P.C. for the provision of Outpatient Services, Intensive Outpatient Treatment, Recovery Services, Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) Services, and treatment through the MHSOAC Grant Funded MAT Pilot, for Medi-Cal members, for the recover and treatment of substance use disorders.

The evidenced-based treatment programs provided by Recover Medical Group are designed to help reach Nevada County individuals and families who live rurally, by providing a telehealth option. This is particularly helpful for residents in Truckee as well as for young people who may be more interested in the privacy and flexibility of virtual services. Recover Medical Group helps clients to achieve and maintain healthy and rewarding lives, leading to long-term self-sufficiency and the restoration of family systems.

Additionally, Recover Medical Group will continue implementing a low-barrier MAT pilot program located at the Common Resource Center, specifically targeting unhoused and vulnerable members of our community located in the Brunswick Basin. MAT services include FDA-approved medications and biological products to treat Alcohol Use Disorder (AUD), Opioid Use Disorder (OUD), and any SUD. MAT may be provided in clinical or non-clinical settings and can be delivered as a standalone service or as part of a level of care covered by DMC-ODS Services. The Contractor shall provide MAT to individuals, including both youth and adults, for whom MAT is clinically appropriate.

It is recommended that the Board approve this Amendment No. 1 as the services provided will help program participants achieve and maintain healthy and stable lives, leading to long-term self-sufficiency and the restoration of family systems. Amendment of this contract increasing the contract amount will allow critical services to continue for people who are struggling with substance use disorder needs. The inclusion of the MAT pilot program is expected to further enhance the effectiveness of treatment and recovery efforts within the community.
