SUBJECT: Resolution accepting an amended memorandum of understanding between the County of Nevada and the City of Grass Valley regarding inspections mandated by senate bill 1383

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the attached Resolution.

FUNDING: Costs to provide service are included in current FY 24-25 Environmental Health budget. Additional staff time and related costs are required to implement 1383; the time and related costs will be absorbed by current staff for FY 24-25. See below for further detail. There is no effect to the general fund in FY 24-25.

BACKGROUND:

SB 1383 regulations require cities and counties, among other things, to implement programs requiring organic waste generators and waste haulers to meet minimum standards for organic waste collection services, inspect waste containers for prohibited contamination of materials, provide education and outreach information to organic waste generators, report to CalRecycle on compliance with the SB 1383 Regulations, and maintain records of compliance with the SB 1383 Regulations.

The Environmental Health Department, via the 2023 Board Resolution #23-581, entered a MOU with the City of Grass Valley for the implementation of SB 1383 at all Tier I and Tier II facilities within the City of Grass Valley city limits. The 2023 MOU did not identify all the facility types that would be inspected, and this amended MOU corrects this lack of information.

This amended MOU provides additional detail in the types of facilities that will be inspected by the Environmental Health Department and includes definitions for each of the facilities as well.

The City of Grass Valley and the Environmental Health Department of Nevada County wish to enter this amended MOU to clarify the roles and responsibilities to implement the SB 1383 Regulations the County will assume on the City's behalf under this MOU's terms and conditions.
