### **OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NEVADA**

#### **RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF THE REQUIRED DOCUMENTS AND AGREEMENTS FOR THE SUBMISSION OF THE APPLICATION FOR THE WILDFIRE PREVENTION GRANTS PROGRAM FOR BRUSH AND DEBRIS REMOVAL UNDER THE CALIFORNIA CLIMATE INVESTMENTS FIRE PREVENTION GRANT PROGRAM.**

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of California in cooperation with the California State Legislature has enacted State of California Climate Investments, which provides funds to the State of California and its political subdivisions for fire prevention programs; and

WHEREAS, the State Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) has been delegated the responsibility for the administration for the program within the State, setting up necessary procedures governing application by local agencies, non-profit organizations, and others under the program; and

WHEREAS, the applicant, Nevada County Department of Public Works, will enter into agreement with the State of California to carry out wildfire prevention through brush and debris removal, see Exhibit A for a draft of this application;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Nevada County Board of Supervisors:

1. Authorizes the Director of Public Works to submit a grant application for “California Climate Investments Fire Prevention Grant Program” with the proceeds from such grant to be used to finance the wildfire prevention through brush and debris removal.
2. Certifies that said applicant has or will have sufficient funds to operate and maintain the project.
3. Certifies that funds under the jurisdiction of the Nevada County Board of Supervisors are available to begin the project.
4. Certifies that said applicant will expend grant funds prior to March 15, 2026.
5. Authorizes the Director of Public Works to execute additional documents as necessary to implement this grant.
6. Nevada County Board of Supervisors approval will be obtained for acceptance of grant if awarded.
