RESOLUTION APPROVING AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO THE AGREEMENT WITH UNITED WAY OF NEVADA COUNTY TO REALLOCATE \$24,000 IN GRANT FUNDS TO THE OFFICE OF EMERGENCY SERVICES TO CONTINUE BUILDING COLLABORATIVE COMMUNITY EDUCATION AROUND WILDFIRE PREPAREDNESS WITH A FOCUS ON GO BAGS, AUTHORIZE THE DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES TO EXECUTE THE AMENDMENT, AND DIRECTS THE AUDITOR-CONTROLLER TO AMEND THE FISCAL YEAR 2025/26 OFFICE OF EMERGENCY SERVICES BUDGET (4/5 AFFIRMATIVE VOTE REQUIRED)

WHEREAS, on January 10, 2023, the County of Nevada accepted the United Way of Nevada County Grant (Res. 23-025) for the Nevada County Access and Functional Needs Program to support wildfire mitigation activities in the amount of \$24,000; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Safe Council of Nevada County failed to contract and complete the services related to the Access and Functional Needs Program described under Item 2 of the grant agreement; and

WHEREAS, in 2024, OES and UWNC partnered to host the highly successful Go-Bag Party, providing emergency preparedness supplies and educational materials to over 800 Nevada County residents; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend their agreement to allow and provide for continued successful collaboration between the Nevada County Office of Emergency Services (OES) and United Way of Nevada County (UWNC) and have mutually agreed to reallocate \$24,000 in grant funds to continue building collaborative community education around wildfire preparedness with a focus on Go-Bags.



AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT WITH THE COUNTY OF NEVADA AND THE UNITED WAY OF NEVADA COUNTY

THIS AMENDMENT is executed this day of June 24, 2025 by and between COUNTY OF NEVADA and UNITED WAY OF NEVADA COUNTY (UWNC). Said Amendment will amend the prior agreement between the parties entitled **Agreement Between the County of Nevada and the United Way of Nevada County** executed on January 10, 2023 by Resolution No. 23-025.

WHEREAS, on January 10, 2023 the County of Nevada accepted the United Way of Nevada County Grant (Resolution No. 23-025) for the Nevada County Access and Functional Needs Program to support wildfire mitigation activities in the amount of \$24,000; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Safe Council of Nevada County failed to contract and complete the services related to the Access and Functional Needs Program described under Item 2 of the grant agreement; and

WHEREAS, in 2024, OES and UWNC partnered to host the highly successful Go-Bag Party, providing emergency preparedness supplies and educational materials to over 800 Nevada County residents; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend their agreement to allow or provide for continued successful collaboration between the Nevada County Office of Emergency Services (OES) and United Way of Nevada County (UWNC) and have mutually agreed to reallocate \$24,000 in grant funds to continue building collaborative community education around wildfire preparedness with a focus on Go-Bags.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. This amendment shall be effective as of June 24, 2025.
- 2. That paragraph II shall be changed to the following: WHEREAS, in support of the Nevada County Board of Supervisors 2022 Objective to "Lead the community in all hazards planning, preparedness, response and recovery with a focus on wildfire" the Nevada County Office of Emergency Services and the United Way of Nevada County identified a need to support collaborative community education around wildfire and disaster preparedness with an emphasis on Go-Bags.
- 3. That paragraph IV shall be changed to the following: WHEREAS, the United Way of Nevada County has received grant funds from the United Way of Wine Country, the functional intent which align(s) with the Board Objective, the United Way of Nevada County will be granting the \$24,000 in funds to the County of Nevada Office of Emergency Services to support wildfire education and disaster preparedness.
- 4. That Item 1 shall be changed to the following:
 - 1. Fund Allocation: The Nevada County Office of Emergency Services shall amend their budget to include the funds awarded by the United Way of Nevada County. These funds shall be allocated to the Nevada County Office of Emergency Services Outreach and Education Program and shall be in the total amount granted by the United Way of Nevada County (\$24,000).
- That Item 2 shall be changed to the following:
 Use of Funds: The Nevada County Office of Emergency Services agrees to use the funds on expenditures related to providing wildfire and disaster

preparedness education and materials to the Nevada County community with an emphasis on Go Bags. Eligible use of award funds includes, but is not limited to, the provision of outreach materials, emergency preparedness supplies, graphic design services, videography services, meeting materials, outreach event supplies and fees, translation services, and media services that support the dissemination of critical wildfire and disaster preparedness information to the Nevada County Community.

- 6. That Item 3 shall be changed to the following:
 - **3. Term of Agreement:** This Agreement shall commence on the date of the last signature of this grant agreement. All funds provided by this Agreement shall be expended by June 1, 2026.
- 7. That Item 5 shall be changed to the following:
 - **5. Reporting:** Upon the completion of the term, the Nevada County Office of Emergency Services shall submit a report no later than 60 days after the expiration of this Agreement. The report shall summarize how the funds were used, include photographs of materials purchased, and provide purchase backup documentation.
- 8. That in all other respects, the prior agreement of the parties shall remain in full force and effect except as amended herein.

Agreement between the County of Nevada and the United Way of Nevada County

This Agreement is made and entered into as of the 1st day of December 2022 by and between the COUNTY OF NEVADA, a political subdivision of the State of California ("County"), and the United Way of Nevada County ("UWNC"), collectively the "Parties" (individually as "Party").

WHEREAS, in support of the Nevada County Board of Supervisors 2022 Objective to "Lead the community in all hazards planning, preparedness, response and recovery with a focus on wildfire" the Nevada County Office of Emergency Services and the United Way of Nevada County identified a need to support the Access and Functional Needs Program for seniors, low-income, and residents with disabilities to ensure that these vulnerable community members receive support in achieving defensible space around their residences.

WHEREAS, the United Way of Nevada County works to support its partners and the residents of Nevada County in building better lives and meeting their basic needs.

WHEREAS, the United Way of Nevada County has received grant funds from the United Way of the Wine Country, the functional intent of which align(s) with the Board Objective, the United Way of Nevada County will be granting twenty-four thousand (\$24,000) in funds to the County of Nevada Office of Emergency Services to support the Access and Functional Needs Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- Fund Allocation: Nevada County Office of Emergency Services shall amend their budget to include the funds awarded by United Way of Nevada County. These funds shall be allocated to the Access and Functional Needs Program and shall be in the total amount granted by the United Way of Nevada County (\$24,000).
- 2. Use of Funds: The Nevada County Office of Emergency Services agrees to use the funds on expenditures related to providing defensible space services to eligible parties under the Access and Function Needs Program. Eligible use of award funds includes, but is not limited to, provision of contract tree services, mastication services, or other fuels reduction/vegetation services and associated salary, benefits, and equipment costs to ensure that defensible space objectives are met for residents included in the Phase I AFN Program funded by FEMA.
- 3. **Term of Agreement:** This Agreement shall commence on the date of last signature of this grant agreement. All funds provided by this Agreement shall be expended by April 2, 2023.
- 4. **Electronic Signatures:** The parties acknowledge and agree that this Agreement may be executed by electronic signature, which shall be considered as an original signature for all purposes and shall have the same force and effect as an original signature. Without limitation, "electronic signature" shall include faxed or emailed versions of an original signature or electronically scanned and transmitted versions (e.g., via pdf) of an original signature.
- 5. **Reporting**: Upon completion of the term, The Nevada County Office of Emergency Services shall submit a report no later than 60 days after the expiration of this Agreement. The report shall contain the addresses at which services were provided, the total cost of providing the listed services, and before/after photos.

- 6. Entirety of Agreement: This Agreement contains the entire agreement of County and United Way of Nevada County with respect to the subject matter hereof, and no other agreement, statement, or promise made by any Party, or to any employee, officer, or agent of any Party, which is not contained in this Agreement, shall be binding or valid. Should all or any portion of any provision of this Agreement be held unenforceable or invalid for any reason, but the remainder of the Agreement can be enforced without failure of material consideration to any Party, then the remaining portions or provisions shall be unaffected.
- 7. **Exhibits**: All exhibits referred to herein and attached hereto are incorporated herein by this reference.
- 8. Upon request, UWNC or its authorized representative shall have access to and the right to examine all records, books, papers, or documents of the COUNTY related to the Project and use of UWNC funds provided under this Agreement. The COUNTY shall retain such records, books, papers, and documents for a period of not less than five (5) years from the termination date.
- 9. The Parties to this Agreement hereby certify that they are acting independently and not as agents, employees, or joint ventures with each other. Neither Party nor its officers, employees or volunteers are employees of the other.
- 10. The terms and conditions of this Agreement, including any exhibits hereto, may not be amended except in writing, signed by both parties. Any amendment or addendum to this Agreement shall expressly refer to this Agreement.
- 11. The waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be in writing, signed by the Party granting the waiver, and such waiver shall not operate or be construed as a waiver of any other provision of the Agreement.
- 12. Any notices that either Party desires to or is required to give to the other Party or to any other person shall be in writing and either served personally or sent by prepaid first-class mail. Such notices shall be addressed to the other Party at the address set forth below. Either Party may change its address by notifying the other Party of the change of address. Notice shall be deemed received within seventy-two hours from the date of mailing, if mailed as provided in this Paragraph.

13. Assignment: This Agreement may not be assigned by either Party. This Agreement is made and entered into for the sole protection and benefit of COUNTY and the UWNC. No other person or entity shall have any right of action based upon any provision of this Agreement.

- 14. **Governing Law and Venue:** This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California. The venue for any legal proceedings regarding this Agreement.
- 15. Authority: All individuals executing this Agreement on behalf of a Party represents and warrants to the other Party that he or she has authority to bind and commit each such Party to this Agreement.
