SUBJECT: Resolution approving execution of Amendment No. 1 to the renewal contract with Common Purpose for the provision of substance use disorder treatment services and recovery residence services for Nevada County Medi-Cal members to revise Exhibit "A-5", Schedule of Services to reflect an additional recovery residence and increase the maximum contract price from \$4,330,533 to \$4,467,533 (an increase of \$137,000), revise Exhibit "B", Schedule of Charges and Payments to reflect the increase in the maximum contract price for the term of July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026 and authorizing and directing the Auditor-Controller to amend the Behavioral Health Department's Budget for Fiscal Year 2025/26. (4/5 Affirmative Vote Required). (RES. 25-346)

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the attached Resolution.

FUNDING: Funding is provided through Drug Medi-Cal Federal reimbursement, Substance Use Block Grant (SUBG) monies, 2011 Realignment, and reimbursement from Probation and Social Services for participants referred through their departments. A budget amendment is required and is included in this Resolution (4/5 vote required). There are no county general fund dollars required in the Agreement.

BACKGROUND: On July 8, 2025, per Resolution 25-346, the Nevada County Board of Supervisors approved execution of the Professional Services Contract with Common Purpose for services related to substance use disorder treatment for Nevada County residents. The contract includes the following components: Full spectrum services within the modalities of Outpatient Drug Free (ODF) Treatment and Intensive Outpatient (IOT) Treatment; Residential Treatment, Withdrawal Management Programs; Recovery Residences; and the Recovery Incentives Program.

This amendment seeks to increase the outpatient services budget to better support Nevada County residents in accessing this critical level of care. The budget for residential services is decreased to reflect a later-than-anticipated opening date, but sufficient funds remain to utilize the facility fully

for the remainder of the fiscal year. In addition, the amendment provides funding to support an additional Recovery Residence for individuals participating in outpatient treatment. In September 2025, Common Purpose opened the Colfax House, adding nine new beds to Nevada County's substance use disorder continuum of care.

It is recommended the Board approve this Amendment as these contracted services provide a cohesive system for Substance Use Disorder intervention, assessment, treatment, and recovery that enhances the well-being of individuals and families which helps to achieve and maintain healthy and rewarding lifestyles for individuals and families.
