SUBJECT: Resolution authorizing execution of an intergovernmental agreement between Nevada County and the United States Marshals Service to house federal detainees at the Wayne Brown Correctional Facility and continue the Jail Capital Projects Reserve within the General Fund.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Approve the resolution.

<u>FUNDING</u>: This is a revenue contract and impacts the Sheriff's Office Wayne Brown Correctional Facility Budget for FY 19-20. There is no negative impact to the General Fund.

BACKGROUND: In 1993 the Sheriff's Office entered into an agreement with the United States Marshals Service to house federal detainees at the Wayne Brown Correctional Facility. In 2008 the agreement was updated to receive a payment of \$70 per inmate per day and \$35 per hour reimbursement for transportation purposes. The new agreement increases the rate to \$136 per inmate per day, and a reimbursement of \$57 per hour for transportation purposes. Additional revenues received from the US Marshals Service for the Wayne Brown Correctional Facility FY 19-20 Budget is estimated to be \$250,000.

Funds received from the Federal Marshals Service since 2008 for Inmate Housing and transportation are in excess of \$17,700,000.

Resolution 08-026 also established a reserve within the General fund to be know as the Jail Capital Project Reserve to be used for projects related to the Wayne Brown Correction Facility and other needs of the Sheriff's office not otherwise funded. Some of the projects funded by this reserve include multiple significant electronic security upgrades, the new roof on the facility, painting and exterior retexturing of the facility and the contraband scanning devices.
