SUBJECT: Resolution authorizing execution of a renewal contract with Stanford Youth Solutions DBA Stanford Sierra Youth & Families for the provision of comprehensive Specialty Mental Health Services, primarily targeted to serve pre- and post-adoptive and guardianship children and their families in the maximum amount of \$2,341,369 for the term of July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2027.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the attached Resolution.

FUNDING: Multiple funding sources are braided together to support these key programs. Services are mainly funded by Medi-Cal Federal Financial Participation (FFP), 2011 Realignment funds, and Behavioral Health Services Act (BHSA) monies. Additionally, the contract is supported by PSSF (Promoting Safe and Stable Families) annual allocation monies. The services were planned for in the department FY 2026/27 budget and the agreement requires no county general fund dollars.

BACKGROUND: Under the current contract, Stanford Sierra Youth & Families (SSYS) provides comprehensive specialized mental health and rehabilitation services for children and youth. The primary target population is pre- and post-adoptive and guardianship children and families. The service area includes both Eastern and Western Nevada County. Services focus on issues related to trauma and permanency for those children who have been removed from birth families.

This population is at risk for a range of mental health illnesses and social-emotional behavioral difficulties stemming from negative pre-adoptive experiences. Some of the more common mental health problems that these particular children/youth may be prone to include depression, learning/attention problems, low self-esteem, social or peer-related problems, attention deficit disorder, lingering effects of trauma, attachment issues, and risky behavioral problems including alcohol/drug abuse and self-destructive behavior.

Additionally, the contract includes Family Preservation and In-Home Parenting Services. The Family Preservation Program is a multi-disciplinary approach to ensure that families at risk of child abuse and/or neglect or mandatory Child Welfare Services (CWS) intervention can stay together. The program services are managed and authorized by Behavioral Health; however, Child Welfare Services works closely with the Contractor.

In FY 2026/27, SSYS will provide Functional Family Therapy (FFT), an evidenced based practice mandated as a part of BH-CONNECT. FFT will support families and clients who are a part of the juvenile justice program and need support in strengthening the family system as a whole.

It is recommended the Board approve this renewal contract as it provides for a comprehensive, integrated approach for services that promote child development and improves outcomes for the successful integration into an adoptive family or guardianship situation as well as encourages family preservation and family reunification when appropriate.
