## OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NEVADA

### RESOLUTION APPROVING THE REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS (RFP) AND AWARD SELECTION PROCEDURES FOR “PINES TO MINES ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT” CONTRACT, AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASING DIVISION TO ADVERTISE FOR QUALIFIED PROPOSALS AND DIRECTING THE AUDITOR-CONTROLLER TO INCREASE THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT BUDGET BY \$100,000.00 IN FISCAL YEAR 2021-22 (4/5 AFFIRMATIVE VOTE REQUIRED)

WHEREAS, the Pines to Mines Trail will gain regional and national attention through its long distance, varied terrain, unique habitats, and majestic views as it connects the Town of Truckee to the City of Nevada City; and

WHEREAS, the Pines to Mines Trail will benefit economic development in both the East and West sides of Nevada County; and

WHEREAS, the impacts on County trail recreation systems has been exacerbated as a result of COVID-driven Public Health orders to avoid congregating indoors; and

WHEREAS, the Pines to Mines Trail project was spearheaded by District V Supervisor Richard Anderson and has been a priority for a network of passionate non-profit organizations including the Bear Yuba Land Trust, Truckee Trails Foundation, Gold Country Trails Council and Bicyclists of Nevada County since the Summer of 2015; and

WHEREAS, the yet-to-be-built Pines to Mines trail connection is entirely on Tahoe National Forest land; and

WHEREAS, The Tahoe National Forest has sole authority to set the scope of and authorize a National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Environmental Assessment (EA) per the NEPA Forest Services Handbook Chapter 11; and

WHEREAS, the County of Nevada desires to advance the completion of the Pines to Mines trail by funding the required Environmental Assessment and environmental studies required to meet California Environmental Quality Act requirements for non-motorized trails; and

WHEREAS, in January 2020 and 2021 the Board of Supervisors during their Board Workshop discussed funding the Pines to Mines Environmental Review in the amount of \$100,000.00 as part of their Economic Development planning.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Nevada County Board of Supervisors of the County of Nevada, State of California that:

1. The Request for Proposals (RFP) for the "Pines to Mines Environmental Assessment" award selection procedures is hereby approved in substantially the same form as attached hereto, as amended pursuant to direction given by the Board of Supervisors during the public meeting of August 10, 2021, and authority is hereby given to the County Executive Officer to make any amendments or additions as are necessary to comply with all laws and guidelines; and
2. The Purchasing Division is authorized to advertise for proposals from the qualified entities, and authorizes the formation of an evaluation committee as outlined in the amended RFP to review the responsive proposals, score each proposal per the criteria described in the RFP, and make recommendations to the County Executive Officer who will develop and bring back the final recommendation to the Nevada County Board of Supervisors for approval; and
3. The Auditor-Controller is directed to release \$100,000.00 from the Economic Development Assignment in the General Fund Balance and make the following adjustments to the Economic Development Budget in Fiscal Year 2021-22.

## 1.0 INTRODUCTION

Nevada County is inviting proposals from qualified firms to provide project management for completion of a National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Environmental Assessment for the Pines to Mines proposed new trail section in the Sierra Nevada Mountains. Additionally, environmental studies would be needed to meet California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requirements of Appendix G. Nevada County seeks a qualified Proposer with past experience working with the Tahoe National Forest (TNF), expertise, and qualifications to complete the NEPA Environmental Assessment (EA) meeting the Tahoe National Forest requirements as outlined in the attached Non Funded Challenge Cost Share Agreement. The County will be looking to partner with the selected vendor to provide the associated professional services to enter into the Non Funded Challenge Cost Share Agreement with the TNF, complete its requirements and satisfy the terms of the Agreement resulting in a signed Final Decision Notice by the TNF Supervisor.

The County is seeking only firms with experience working with the TNF and can complete the proposed schedule of services with a budget at or less than \$100,000.00 including reimbursables.

This RFP will result in the award of one contract to be effective for an initial term of approximately two (2) years, with an option to renew the contract for two additional one-year periods, at the County's discretion.

This RFP includes a description of the scope of work, proposal requirements, and instructions for submitting your proposal.

## 3.0 BACKGROUND

The Pines To Mines Trail project was formed by the Truckee Trails Foundation, Gold Country Trails Council, Bicyclists Of Nevada County and Bear Yuba Land Trust in 2015 for the purpose of establishing a multi-use earthen trail to connect Truckee and Nevada City. The County of Nevada joined the effort in the Summer of 2019 to offer meeting facilitation and coordination support. The Tahoe National Forest has also been a partner in the planning process and will maintain ownership and responsibility of the newly constructed trail sections.

Well-built trails currently exist at both ends of the proposed route. A new trail section of 18-22 miles will provide new single-track trail connectivity to the existing trails of Grouse Ridge Trail (as west end) and the Hole In The Ground Trail (at east end). All new trail construction at this phase of the project will occur on lands owned by the Tahoe National Forest. Trail segments will be connected by sections of road crossing three Sections owned by Sierra Pacific Industries (SPI).

Trail construction design standards must adhere to state and national guidelines with widths between 18-36" with a climbing turn radius of no less than 6' and 10' design clearing height. The trail's layout will maintain a general 5% average gradient, excluding short pitches for reverse grades (every 75-100') and occasionally, out of necessity. Rolling contours, and grade reversals (curvilinear design) will be implemented to minimize trail erosion and moderate speed of travel. The trail will be designed to minimize user conflicts and create the best overall experience possible for all users. Bridges, turnpikes, puncheons, etc., will be as natural as possible and to United States Forest Service specifications. The Pines to Mines Trail is intended to be a rugged backcountry, multi-use, trail in character and user experience.

## 4.0 SCOPE OF SERVICES

The selected proposer (hereinafter referred to as "Provider"), shall provide project management, working with the TNF as the lead agency to prepare an Environmental Assessment (EA) for a new 18-22 mile non-motorized trail section as part of the Pines To Mines Trail connecting Truckee and Nevada City, CA. The new trail will connect the 'Hole In The Ground Trail' to the 'Grouse Ridge Trail' in the Tahoe National Forest (TNF).

Additionally, any and all technical studies will need to include analysis to meet California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines included in Appendix G. Additional technical studies will also be required to meet all CEQA requirements for completion of the checklist outlined in Appendix G of CEQA in order to be used for a potential future CEQA Initial Study.

### 4.1 The Provider(s) shall deliver the following services:

- A. Completion of all requirements included in the attached Challenge Cost Share Agreement with the Tahoe National Forest (Attachment 1)

### 4.2 Deliverables

- A. The EA and associated documents shall be prepared and submitted to the TNF by the Provider according to NEPA and USFS regulations and policies, and will contain all sections required by NEPA, the Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) regulations, and other applicable federal, state, and local regulations, policies, and guidelines.

The document shall meet requirements for Section 106 of NHPA and public review elements of NHPA shall be coordinated closely with the NEPA public review process and documents.

- B. Provider will submit the complete NEPA document to the TNF after review by County staff within 2 years after the signing of the Contract between the County and the Provider.
- C. Provider will remain responsive to County and TNF requests pertinent to the project until receiving a Signed Decision from the TNF Supervisor regarding the submitted Pines to Mines NEPA study.

### 4.3 Communication Requirements

Provider shall comply with the following communication requirements:

1. Every month, provide an email update on progress to Nevada County Executive Office staff.
2. Cc staff from the County Executive Office on all communications between the Provider and the Tahoe National Forest
3. Facilitate quarterly team update meetings between the TNF, Nevada County, and any other required stakeholders.
4. Annually – Provide Progress Reports to the Nevada County Board of Supervisors during a scheduled Board meeting in collaboration with County staff.

5. Upon delivery of a signed decision from the NTF Supervisor provide a summary report of the NEPA process efforts to the County of Nevada County Executive Office including recommended follow up actions if needed.

## 5.0 ASSURANCE OF DESIGNATED STAFF

Proposer shall assure that the designated staff, including sub-consultants (if any), is used for this project. Departure or reassignment of, or substitution for, any member of the designated staff or sub-consultant(s) shall not be made without the prior written approval of the County.

## 6.0 GENERAL TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 6.1 **Standard Contract.** Upon completion of the evaluation and recommendation for award, the selected firm will be required to execute a Professional Services Contract, a draft of which is included as **Attachment C**.
- 6.2 **Independent Contractor.** At all times the Consultant shall represent himself/herself to be an independent contractor offering such services to the public and shall not represent himself/herself, or his/her employees, to be an employee of the County of Nevada. Therefore, the Consultant shall assume all legal and financial responsibility for taxes, FICA, employee fringe benefits, workers compensation, employee insurance, minimum wage requirements, overtime, etc., and agrees to indemnify, save, and hold the County of Nevada, its officers, agents, and employees, harmless from and against, any and all loss, cost (including attorney fees), and damage of any kind related to such matters.
- 6.3 **Publicity Clause:** Awarded firm(s) shall obtain prior written approval from the County for use of information relating to the County or any resulting Agreement in advertisements, brochures, promotional materials or media, press releases or other informational avenues.
- 6.4 **Non-Appropriation.** The County may terminate any resulting contract at the end of any fiscal year, June 30th, without further liability other than payment of debt incurred during such fiscal year, should funds not be appropriated by its governing body to continue services for which the contract was intended.
- 6.5 **Conflict of Interest.** The Consultant shall warrant that no official or employee of the County has an interest, has been employed or retained to solicit or aid in the procuring of the resulting contract, nor that any such person will be employed in the performance of such contract without immediate divulgence of such fact to the County.
- 6.6 **Non-Collusion.** Firms submitting proposals shall warrant that their offer is made without any previous understanding, agreement or connection with any person, firm or corporation submitting a separate proposal for the same project and is in all respects fair, without outside control, collusion, fraud or otherwise illegal action. This condition shall not apply to proposals which are submitted by firms who have partnered with others to submit a cooperative proposal that clearly identifies a primary contractor and the associated sub-contractors.
- 6.7 **Indemnification & Insurance Requirements.** The County's standard indemnification and insurance requirements are provided in the draft contract, **Attachment C**. All costs of complying with the insurance requirements shall be included in your pricing. The selected firm shall provide complete and valid insurance certificates within ten (10)

days of the County's written request. Failure to provide the documents within the time stated may result in the rejection of the firm's proposal.

- 6.8 Protests and Appeals.** In accordance with Section 6.0 of the Nevada County Purchasing Policy Manual, any actual or prospective proposer, offeror, or contractor who is aggrieved in connection with the solicitation or award of a contract may appeal to the Director of Information and General Services. The protest shall be submitted in writing to the Director of Information and General Services within five (5) calendar days after such aggrieved person or company knows, or should have known, of the facts giving rise thereto.

## 7.0 PROPOSAL FORMAT REQUIREMENTS

Each response to this RFP shall include the information described in this section. Provide the information in the specified order. Failure to include all of the elements specified may be cause for rejection. Additional information may be provided, but should be succinct and relevant to the goals of this RFP. Excessive information will not be considered favorably.

All copies of the proposal should be bound or contained in loose leaf binders. Document pages shall be 8-1/2 inches by 11 inches in size or folded to such a size. Use section dividers, tabbed in accordance with this Section as specified below.

### 7.1 Cover Letter with the following information:

- Title of this RFP
- Name and mailing address of firm (include physical location if mailing address is a PO Box)
- Contact person, Email address, telephone number, and fax number.

The County will use email to notify your firm of critical developments such as interview schedules, notification of selection/non-selection, etc. Therefore, it is essential that you identify one or more contact persons who has frequent access to email. The County will not be responsible for delivery failure of email due to firewalls, spam filters, or individuals' failure to retrieve email messages. The County will not attempt to re-deliver any messages which fail due to no fault of the County.

### 7.2 Signature Requirements - The Cover Letter must be signed by an officer empowered by the Consultant to sign such material and thereby commit the Consultant to the obligations contained in the RFP response. Further, the signing and submission of a response shall indicate the intention of the proposer to adhere to the provisions described in this RFP and a commitment to enter a binding contract.

- Proposals submitted on behalf of a Partnership shall be signed in the firm name by a partner or the Attorney-In-Fact. If signed by the Attorney-In-Fact, there shall be attached to the proposal a Power-Of-Authority evidencing authority to sign proposals, dated the same date as the proposal and executed by all partners of the firm.
- Proposals which are submitted on behalf of a Corporation shall have the correct corporate name thereon and the actual signature of the authorized officer of the



corporation written (not typed) below the corporate name. The title of the office held by the person signing for the corporation shall appear below the signature of the officer.

- Proposals which are submitted by an Individual doing business under a firm name ("dba") shall be signed in the name of the individual doing business under the proper firm name and style.

- 7.3 TAB A: Firm's Qualifications** – Describe the firm and provide a statement of the firm's qualifications for performing requested consulting services. Identify the services which would be completed by your firm's staff and those that would be provided by sub-consultants, if any. Identify any sub-consultants you propose to utilize to supplement your firm's staff. Include the Firm's Organization Chart, including its constituent parts, and size variation of staffing levels in the past five years.
- 7.4 TAB B: Experience and References** – Provide a summary of the firm's experience in providing these or similar services (specifically working with the Tahoe National Forest (TNF)). Provide a minimum of three references for related projects or service agreements, including dates, contact person and phone number, and a brief description of the project or agreement. Public sector references are preferred.
- 7.5 TAB C: Qualifications of Team** – Provide a brief summary of the qualifications and experience of each team member assigned to this project, including length of service with the firm and résumé, and the qualifications/experience of any sub consultant staff on your project team. Include an organization chart of the staff available for project and the designated project manager/lead for each applicable category.
- 7.6 TAB D: Project Plan** – Provide a detailed discussion of your firm's approach to the successful implementation of this project. Include thorough discussions of methodologies you believe are essential to accomplishing this project. Include a proposed work schedule to accomplish all of the required tasks within the desired timeline. Identify the staff who would be assigned to each task, including sub consultants. Describe any possible road blocks to the completion of this project that you anticipate.
- 7.7 TAB E: Fiduciary Responsibility** – Describe how your Agency will, with a budget of \$100,000.00 or less utilize funds to the maximum amount possible. Explain how you will stretch the funds to obtain the maximum benefit to the County. Describe any cost saving solutions your Agency may seek to achieve utilizing the budget to the maximum amount. Define ways your Agency will bring this project in under budget. Should your budget exceed the allocated amount, explain how your Firm intends to offset needed funds to complete this project.
- 7.8 TAB F: Bonus Section** – Applicants will be provided additional points for describing how they will provide supplemental funds to cover additional costs should the project requirements exceed above the proposed budget. Bonus points may also be offered for items such as early submittal of NEPA application, expedited project execution or other value added solutions to complete this process.
- 7.9 TAB G: Required Statements** – This section must include the statements identified below. For your convenience, you may complete and return **Attachment A**.

- A. A statement that the submitting firm will perform the services and adhere to the requirements described in this RFP, including any addenda (**reference the addenda by date and/or number**).
- B. Subsequent to award of this RFP, all or part of any submittal may be released to any person or firm who may request it, as prescribed by the State of California Public Records Act (PRA). Proposers shall include a statement that describes the specific portion(s) of their submittal that they consider exempt from disclosure under the PRA. In the event the County receives a PRA request for documents that may include some or all of the submittal, the County will consider the proposer's statement, but will make its own determination as to what will be released. County will then notify the submitting firm of its determination and provide the submitting party with 10 days in which to seek legal remedies to prevent such disclosure.
- C. Include a statement of assurance that you will not substitute members of your designated team without approval by Nevada County staff (per **Section 6.0**)
- D. Include a statement which declares there is no Conflict of Interest (per **Section 7.5**)
- E. Provide a statement attesting there has been no Collusion (see **Section 7.6**)
- F. Indicate your ability and agreement to fulfill the indemnification and insurance requirements contained in the draft contract (**Section 7.7**). (Please note that actual Certificates of Insurance are not required as part of your submittal.)
- G. Provide a statement certifying that your firm is not currently subject to debarment under Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 29

**7.10 TAB H: Exceptions** – Describe any and all proposed exceptions, alterations or amendments to the Scope of Work or other requirements of this RFP, including the Draft Contract (**Attachment C**). The nature and scope of your proposed exceptions may affect the evaluation of your submittal and the County's determination of whether it is possible to successfully negotiate a contract with your firm/individual.

**7.11 Cost Proposal** – Cost Proposals are required to be submitted along with the providers initial proposal and are expected to be at or under the amount of \$100,000.00.

When preparing your Cost Proposal, use the form provided in **Attachment B** and provide the proposed costs for each category specified.

**All cost proposals shall be signed and dated per Section 7.2 above.**

- 8.4 Faxed and/or emailed proposals shall not be accepted.
- 8.5 The County of Nevada shall not be responsible for proposals delivered to a person or location other than that specified herein.
- 8.6 Late submittals shall not be accepted or considered.
- 8.7 All submittals shall be submitted in a sealed envelope or container, and clearly marked with the RFP number and title on the outside of the parcel.
- 8.8 All submittals, whether selected or rejected, shall become the property of Nevada County, and will not be returned.
- 8.9 The County reserves the right to waive minor defects and/or irregularities in proposals, and shall be the sole judge of the materiality of any such defect or irregularity.
- 8.10 All costs associated with proposal preparation shall be borne by the offeror.
- 8.11 All proposals shall remain firm for **one hundred twenty (120) days** following the closing date for the receipt of proposals.

## 10.0 SELECTION PROCEDURE

- 10.1 Submittals will be reviewed for responsiveness, and responsive submittals will further be screened by a selection committee in accordance with the above criteria. The firm(s) submitting the highest rated proposal may be invited for interviews.
- 10.2 Interviews will be held solely at the County’s option. The County will use the above criteria to score and rank firms’ responses to interview questions or instructions, in addition to other relevant information provided or requested.
- 10.3 The County reserves the right to make an award without further discussion of the submittal with the proposer. Therefore, the proposal should be submitted initially on the most favorable terms that the firm or individual might propose.
- 10.4 The County reserves the right to award a contract to the firm(s) that presents the best qualifications and whose proposal best accomplishes the desired results.
- 10.5 The County reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, or to waive minor irregularities in said proposals, or to negotiate with the successful firm(s). In the case of differences between written words and figures in a proposal, the amount stated in written words shall govern. In the case of a difference in unit price versus the extended figure, the unit price shall govern.
- 10.6 The County will notify all proposers whether or not they are selected for the subject work. Email is the County’s preferred method of communication for all stages of the RFP process.

2. **Payment** County shall pay Contractor for services rendered pursuant to this Contract at the time and in the amount set forth in Exhibit B. The payments specified in Exhibit B shall be the only payment made to Contractor for services rendered pursuant to this Contract. 7. **Time for Performance** Time is of the essence. Contractor shall devote such time to the performance of services pursuant to this Contract as may be reasonably necessary for the satisfactory performance of Contractor's obligations pursuant to this Contract. Neither party shall be considered in default of this Contract to the extent performance is prevented or delayed by any cause, present or future, which is beyond the reasonable control of the party.

8. **Relationship of Parties**

9.1. **Independent Contractor**

In providing services herein, Contractor, and the agents and employees thereof, shall work in an independent capacity and as an independent contractor and not as agents or employees of County. Contractor acknowledges that it customarily engages independently in the trade, occupation, or business as that involved in the work required herein. Further, the Parties agree that Contractor shall perform the work required herein free from the control and direction of County, and that the nature of the work is outside the usual course of the County's business. In performing the work required herein, Contractor shall not be entitled to any employment benefits, Workers' Compensation, or other programs afforded to County employees. Contractor shall hold County harmless and indemnify County against such claim by its agents or employees. County makes no representation as to the effect of this independent contractor relationship on Contractor's previously earned California Public Employees Retirement System ("CalPERS") retirement benefits, if any, and Contractor specifically assumes the responsibility for making such determination. Contractor shall be responsible for all reports and obligations including but not limited to: social security taxes, income tax withholding, unemployment insurance, disability insurance, workers' compensation and other applicable federal and state taxes.

9.2. **No Agent Authority** Contractor shall have no power to incur any debt, obligation, or liability on behalf of County or otherwise to act on behalf of County as an agent. Neither County nor any of its agents shall have control over the conduct of Contractor or any of Contractor's employees, except as set forth in this Contract. Contractor shall not represent that it is, or that any of its agents or employees are, in any manner employees of the County.

9.3. **Indemnification of CalPERS Determination** In the event that Contractor or any employee, agent, or subcontractor of Contractor providing service under this Contract or is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction or CalPERS to be eligible for enrollment in CalPERS as an employee of the County, Contractor shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless County for all payments on behalf of Contractor or its employees, agents, or subcontractors, as well as for the payment of any penalties and interest on such contributions, which would otherwise be the responsibility of County.

9. **Assignment and Subcontracting** Except as specifically provided herein, the rights, responsibilities, duties and Services to be performed under this Contract are personal to the Contractor and may not be transferred, subcontracted, or assigned without the prior written



consent of County. Contractor shall not substitute or replace any personnel for those specifically named herein or in its proposal without the prior written consent of County.

Contractor shall cause and require each transferee, subcontractor, and assignee to comply with the insurance provisions set forth herein, to the extent such insurance provisions are required of Contractor under this Contract. Failure of Contractor to so cause and require such compliance by each transferee, subcontractor, and assignee shall constitute a Material Breach of this Contract, and, in addition to any other remedy available at law or otherwise, shall serve as a basis upon which County may elect to suspend payments hereunder, or terminate this Contract, or both.

10. **Licenses, Permits, Etc.** Contractor represents and warrants to County that Contractor shall, at its sole cost and expense, obtain or keep in effect at all times during the term of this Contract, any licenses, permits, and approvals which are legally required for Contractor to practice its profession at the time the services are performed.
  
11. **Hold Harmless and Indemnification Contract** To the fullest extent permitted by law, each Party (the "Indemnifying Party") hereby agrees to protect, defend, indemnify, and hold the other Party (the "Indemnified Party"), its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers, free and harmless from any and all losses, claims, liens, demands, and causes of action of every kind and character resulting from the Indemnifying Party's negligent act, willful misconduct, or error or omission, including, but not limited to, the amounts of judgments, penalties, interest, court costs, legal fees, and all other expenses incurred by the Indemnified Party arising in favor of any party, including claims, liens, debts, personal injuries, death, or damages to property (including employees or property of the Indemnified Party) and without limitation, all other claims or demands of every character occurring or in any way incident to, in connection with or arising directly or indirectly out of, the Contract. The Indemnifying Party agrees to investigate, handle, respond to, provide defense for, and defend any such claims, demand, or suit at the sole expense of the Indemnifying Party, using legal counsel approved in writing by Indemnified Party. Indemnifying Party also agrees to bear all other costs and expenses related thereto, even if the claim or claims alleged are groundless, false, or fraudulent. This provision is not intended to create any cause of action in favor of any third party against either Party or to enlarge in any way either Party's liability but is intended solely to provide for indemnification of the Indemnified Party from liability for damages, or injuries to third persons or property, arising from or in connection with Indemnifying Party's performance pursuant to this Contract. This obligation is independent of, and shall not in any way be limited by, the minimum insurance obligations contained in this Contract.
  
12. **Standard of Performance** Contractor shall perform all services required pursuant to this Contract in the manner and according to the standards observed by a competent practitioner of the profession in which Contractor is engaged in the geographical area in which Contractor practices its profession. All products of whatsoever nature which Contractor delivers to County pursuant to this Contract shall be prepared in a substantial first class and workmanlike manner and conform to the standards or quality normally observed by a person practicing in Contractor's profession.

Contractor without additional compensation. Contractor's personnel, when on the County's premises and when accessing the County network remotely, shall comply with the County's regulations regarding security, remote access, safety and professional conduct, including but not limited to Nevada County Security Policy NCSP-102 Nevada County External User Policy and Account Application regarding data and access security. Contractor personnel will solely utilize the County's privileged access management platform for all remote access support functions, unless other methods are granted in writing by the County's Chief Information Officer or his/her designee.

13. **Prevailing Wage and Apprentices** To the extent made applicable by law, performance of this Contract shall be in conformity with the provisions of California Labor Code, Division 2, Part 7, Chapter 1, commencing with section 1720 relating to prevailing wages which must be paid to workers employed on a public work as defined in Labor Code section 1720, et seq., and shall be in conformity with Title 8 of the California Code of Regulations section 200 et seq., relating to apprenticeship. Where applicable:

- Contractor shall comply with the provisions thereof at the commencement of Services to be provided herein, and thereafter during the term of this Contract. A breach of the requirements of this section shall be deemed a material breach of this contract. Applicable prevailing wage determinations are available on the California Department of Industrial Relations website at <http://www.dir.ca.gov/OPRL/PWD>.
- Contractor and all subcontractors must comply with the requirements of Labor Code section 1771.1(a) pertaining to registration of contractors pursuant to section 1725.5. Registration and all related requirements of those sections must be maintained throughout the performance of the Contract.
- Contracts to which prevailing wage requirements apply are subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations. Each Contractor and subcontractor must furnish certified payroll records to the Labor Commissioner at least monthly.
- The County is required to provide notice to the Department of Industrial Relations of any public work contract subject to prevailing wages within five (5) days of award.

14. **Accessibility** It is the policy of the County of Nevada that all County services, programs, meetings, activities and facilities shall be accessible to all persons, and shall comply with the provisions of the Americans With Disabilities Act and Title 24, California Code of Regulations. To the extent this Contract shall call for Contractor to provide County contracted services directly to the public, Contractor shall certify that said direct Services are and shall be accessible to all persons.

15. **Nondiscriminatory Employment** Contractor shall not discriminate in its employment practices because of race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, sex or sexual orientation in contravention of the California Fair Employment and Housing Act, Government Code section 12900 et seq.

16. **Drug-Free Workplace** Senate Bill 1120, (Chapter 1170, Statutes of 1990), requires recipients of state grants to maintain a "drug-free workplace". Every person or organization awarded a

contract for the procurement of any property or services shall certify as required under Government Code Section 8355-8357 that it will provide a drug-free workplace.

17. **Political Activities** Contractor shall in no instance expend funds or use resources derived from this Contract on any political activities.

18. **Financial, Statistical and Contract-Related Records:**

19.1. **Books and Records** Contractor shall maintain statistical records and submit reports as required by County. Contractor shall also maintain accounting and administrative books and records, program procedures and documentation relating to licensure and accreditation as they pertain to this Contract. All such financial, statistical and contract-related records shall be retained for five (5) years or until program review findings and/or audit findings are resolved, whichever is later. Such records shall include but not be limited to bids and all supporting documents, original entry books, canceled checks, receipts, invoices, payroll records, including subsistence, travel and field expenses, together with a general ledger itemizing all debits and credits.

19.2. **Inspection** Upon reasonable advance notice and during normal business hours or at such other times as may be agreed upon, Contractor shall make all of its books and records available for inspection, examination or copying, to County, or to the State Department of Health Care Services, the Federal Department of Health and Human Services, the Controller General of the United States and to all other authorized federal and state agencies, or their duly authorized representatives.

19.3. **Audit** Contractor shall permit the aforesaid agencies or their duly authorized representatives to audit all books, accounts or records relating to this Contract, and all books, accounts or records of any business entities controlled by Contractor who participated in this Contract in any way. All such records shall be available for inspection by auditors designated by County or State, at reasonable times during normal business hours. Any audit may be conducted on Contractor's premises or, at County's option, Contractor shall provide all books and records within fifteen (15) days upon delivery of written notice from County. Contractor shall promptly refund any moneys erroneously charged and shall be liable for the costs of audit if the audit establishes an over-charge of five percent (5%) or more of the Maximum Contract Price.

19. **Termination**

- A. A Material Breach, as defined pursuant to the terms of this Contract or otherwise, in addition to any other remedy available at law or otherwise, shall serve as a basis upon which County may elect to immediately suspend payments hereunder, or terminate this Contract, or both, without notice.
- B. If Contractor fails to timely provide in any manner the services materials and products required under this Contract, or otherwise fails to promptly comply with the terms of this Contract, or violates any ordinance, regulation or other law which applies to its performance herein, County may terminate this Contract by giving **five (5) calendar days written notice to Contractor.**

- C. Either party may terminate this Contract for any reason, or without cause, by giving **thirty (30) calendar days written notice** to the other, which notice shall be sent by registered mail in conformity with the notice provisions, below. In the event of termination not the fault of the Contractor, the Contractor shall be paid for services performed to the date of termination in accordance with the terms of this Contract. Contractor shall be excused for failure to perform services herein if such performance is prevented by acts of God, strikes, labor disputes or other forces over which the Contractor has no control.
- D. County, upon giving **thirty (30) calendar days written notice** to Contractor, shall have the right to terminate its obligations under this Contract at the end of any fiscal year if the County or the State of California, as the case may be, does not appropriate funds sufficient to discharge County's obligations coming due under this contract.

In the event this Contract is terminated:

- 1) Contractor shall deliver copies of all writings prepared by it pursuant to this Contract. The term "writings" shall be construed to mean and include: handwriting, typewriting, printing, photostatting, photographing, and every other means of recording upon any tangible thing any form of communication or representation, including letters, words, pictures, sounds, or symbols, or combinations thereof.
  - 2) County shall have full ownership and control of all such writings delivered by Contractor pursuant to this Contract.
  - 3) County shall pay Contractor the reasonable value of services rendered by Contractor to the date of termination pursuant to this Contract not to exceed the amount documented by Contractor and approved by County as work accomplished to date; provided, however, that in no event shall any payment hereunder exceed the amount of the Contract specified in Exhibit B, and further provided, however, County shall not in any manner be liable for lost profits which might have been made by Contractor had Contractor completed the services required by this Contract. In this regard, Contractor shall furnish to County such financial information as in the judgment of the County is necessary to determine the reasonable value of the services rendered by Contractor. The foregoing is cumulative and does not affect any right or remedy, which County may have in law or equity.
20. **Intellectual Property** To the extent County provides any of its own original photographs, diagrams, plans, documents, information, reports, computer code and all recordable media together with all copyright interests thereto, not the property of Contractor (herein "Intellectual Property"), which concern or relate to this Contract and which have been prepared by, for or submitted to Contractor by County, shall be the property of County, and upon fifteen (15) days demand therefor, shall be promptly delivered to County without exception.
21. **Waiver** One or more waivers by one party of any major or minor breach or default of any provision, term, condition, or covenant of this Contract shall not operate as a waiver of any subsequent breach or default by the other party.

22. **Conflict of Interest** Contractor certifies that no official or employee of the County, nor any business entity in which an official of the County has an interest, has been employed or retained to solicit or aid in the procuring of this Contract. In addition, Contractor agrees that no such person will be employed in the performance of this Contract unless first agreed to in writing by County. This includes prior Nevada County employment in accordance with County Personnel Code.
23. **Entirety of Contract** This Contract contains the entire Contract of County and Contractor with respect to the subject matter hereof, and no other Contract, statement, or promise made by any party, or to any employee, officer or agent of any party, which is not contained in this Contract, shall be binding or valid.
24. **Alteration** No waiver, alteration, modification, or termination of this Contract shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by all parties, except as expressly provided in Section 19, Termination.
25. **Governing Law and Venue** This Contract is executed and intended to be performed in the State of California, and the laws of that State shall govern its interpretation and effect. The venue for any legal proceedings regarding this Contract shall be the County of Nevada, State of California. Each party waives any Federal court removal and/or original jurisdiction rights it may have.
26. **Compliance with Applicable Laws** Contractor shall comply with any and all federal, state and local laws, codes, ordinances, rules and regulations which relate to, concern or affect the Services to be provided by this Contract.
27. **Additional Contractor Responsibilities**
- A. To the extent Contractor is a mandated reporter of suspected child and/or dependent adult abuse and neglect, it shall ensure that its employees, agents, volunteers, subcontractors, and independent contractors are made aware of, understand, and comply with all reporting requirements. Contractor shall immediately notify County of any incident or condition resulting in injury, harm, or risk of harm to any child or dependent adult served under this Contract.
  - B. Contractor will immediately notify County of any active complaints, lawsuits, licensing or regulatory investigations, reports of fraud or malfeasance, or criminal investigations regarding its operations. Contractor agrees to work cooperatively with County in response to any investigation commenced by County with regard to this Contract or the clients served herein, including providing any/all records requested by County related thereto.
  - C. Contractor shall employ reasonable background check procedures on all employees, prospective employees, volunteers and consultants performing work involving direct contact with minor children or dependent adults under this Contract, including fingerprinting and criminal records checks, sexual offender registry checks, and reference checks, including both personal and professional references.

28. **Notification** Any notice or demand desired or required to be given hereunder shall be in writing and deemed given when personally delivered or deposited in the mail, postage prepaid, and addressed to the parties as follows:

## EXHIBIT C

### INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

**Insurance.** Contractor shall procure and maintain for the duration of the contract insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by the Contractor, its agents, representatives, or employees. Coverage shall be at least as broad as:

- i. **Commercial General Liability CGL):** Insurance Services Office Form CG 00 01 covering CGL on an "occurrence" basis, including products and completed operations, property damage, bodily injury and personal & advertising injury with limits no less than **\$2,000,000** per occurrence. If a general aggregate limit applies, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location (ISO CG 25 03 or 25 04) or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
  - vi. **Automobile Liability Insurance** Services Office Form Number CA 0001 covering, Code 1 (any auto), or if Contractor has no owned autos, Code 8 (hired) and 9 (non-owned), with limit no less than **\$1,000,000** per accident for bodily injury and property damage. The Automobile Liability policy shall be endorsed to include Transportation Pollution Liability insurance MCS-90, covering materials to be transported by Contractor pursuant to the contract.
  - vii. **Workers' Compensation** insurance as required by the State of California, with Statutory Limits, and Employer's Liability Insurance with limit of no less than **\$1,000,000** per accident for bodily injury or disease. **(Not required if contractor provides written verification it has no employees).**
- xxiii. If the Contractor maintains broader coverage and/or higher limits than the minimums shown above, the County requires and shall be entitled to the broader coverage and/or the higher limits maintained by the contractor. Any available insurance proceeds in excess of the specified minimum limits of insurance and coverage shall be available to the County.

#### Other Insurance Provisions:

The insurance policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

- i. **Additional Insured Status: The County, its officers, employees, agents, and volunteers are to be covered as additional insureds** on the CGL policy with respect to liability arising out of the work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor including materials, parts, or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. General liability coverage can be provided in the form of an endorsement to the Contractor's insurance (at least as broad as ISO Form CG 20 10 11 85 or both CG 20 10, CG 20 25, CG 20 33, or CG 20 38; and CG 20 37 forms if later revisions used.)
- ii. **Primary Coverage** For any claims related to this contract, the **Contractor's insurance shall be primary** insurance primary coverage at least as broad as ISO CG 20 01 04 13 as respects the County, its officers, employees, agents, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the County, its officers, employees, agents, and volunteers shall be excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
- iii. **Notice of Cancellation** This policy shall not be changed without first giving thirty (30) days prior written notice and ten (10) days prior written notice of cancellation for non-payment of premium to the County of Nevada.

- iv. **Waiver of Subrogation** Contractor hereby grants to County a waiver of any right to subrogation which any insurer or said Contractor may acquire against the County by virtue of the payment of any loss under such insurance. Contractor agrees to obtain any endorsement that may be necessary to affect this waiver of subrogation, but this provision applies regardless of whether or not the County has received a waiver of subrogation endorsement from the insurer.
- v. **Sole Proprietors** If Contractor is a Sole Proprietor and has no employees, they are not required to have Workers Compensation coverage. Contractor shall sign a statement attesting to this condition, and shall agree they have no rights, entitlements or claim against County for any type of employment benefits or workers' compensation or other programs afforded to County employees.
- vi. **Deductible and Self-Insured Retentions** Deductible and Self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the County. The County may require the Contractor to provide proof of ability to pay losses and related investigations, claims administration, and defense expenses within the retention. The Policy language shall provide, or be endorsed to provide, that the self-insured retention may be satisfied by either the named insured or County. **(Note – all deductibles and self-insured retentions must be discussed with risk, and may be negotiated)**
- vii. **Acceptability of Insurers:** Insurance is to be placed with insurers authorized to conduct business in the state with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A:VII, unless otherwise acceptable to the County.
- viii. **Claims Made Policies** if any of the required policies provide coverage on a claims-made basis: **(note – should be applicable only to professional liability)**
- a. The Retroactive Date must be shown and must be before the date of the contract or the beginning of contract work.
  - b. Insurance must be maintained and evidence of insurance must be provided for at least five (5) years after completion of the contract of work.
  - c. If the coverage is canceled or non-renewed, and not replaced with another **claims-made policy form with a Retroactive Date**, prior to the contract effective date, the Contractor must purchase "extended reporting" coverage for a minimum of **five (5)** years after completion of contract work.
- ix. **Verification of Coverage** Contractor shall furnish the County with original Certificates of Insurance including all required amendatory endorsements (or copies of the applicable policy language effecting coverage required by this clause) and a copy of the Declarations and Endorsement Page of the CGL policy listing all policy endorsements to County before work begins. However, failure to obtain and provide verification of the required documents prior to the work beginning shall not waive the Contractor's obligation to provide them. The County reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements required by these specifications, at any time.
- x. **Subcontractors** Contractor shall require and verify that all subcontractors maintain insurance meeting all the requirements stated herein, and Contractor shall ensure that County is an additional insured on insurance required from subcontractors. For CGL coverage subcontractors shall provide coverage with a format at least as broad as CG 20 38 04 13.

- xi. **Special Risks or Circumstances** County reserves the right to modify these requirements, including limits, based on the nature of the risk, prior experience, insurer, coverage, or other special circumstances.
- xii. **Conformity of Coverages** If more than one policy is used to meet the required coverages, such as an umbrella policy or excess policy, such policies shall be following form with all other applicable policies used to meet these minimum requirements. For example, all policies shall be Occurrence Liability policies or all shall be Claims Made Liability policies, if approved by the County as noted above. In no cases shall the types of policies be different.
- xiii. **Premium Payments** The insurance companies shall have no recourse against the COUNTY and funding agencies, its officers and employees or any of them for payment of any premiums or assessments under any policy issued by a mutual insurance company.
- xiv. **Material Breach** Failure of the Contractor to maintain the insurance required by this Contract, or to comply with any of the requirements of this section, shall constitute a material breach of the entire Contract.
- xv. **Certificate Holder** The Certificate Holder on insurance certificates and related documents should read as follows:
