OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NEVADA

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE AMENDMENT OF THE 2013 LOCAL PRIMACY DELEGATION AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH DRINKING WATER BRANCH AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY OF NEVADA ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT TO OPERATE AS THE LOCAL PRIMACY AGENCY

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Law Section 116271(i) on July 1, 2014, assigned the rights, obligations, liabilities and duties of the California Department of Public Health Drinking Water Division with respect to the Local Primacy Delegation Agreement to the State of California Water Resources Control Board, Division of Drinking Water; and

WHEREAS, the State of California Water Resources Control Board requires that all Local Primacy Agencies amend any existing Local Primacy Delegation Agreements to reflect the authority and specific requirements of the California Water Resources Control Board, Division of Drinking Water; and

WHEREAS, such delegation is accomplished by means of a Primacy Delegation Agreement which requires County of Nevada Board of Supervisors Resolution Approval with the Environmental Health Department as the Local Primacy Agency; and

WHEREAS, the Environmental Health Department will submit annual work plans to the State of California Water Resources Control Board, Division of Drinking Water which provide detailed information regarding the program elements to be completed as prescribed by regulation; and

WHEREAS, the date of execution of the Agreement will be March 28, 2017, and shall remain in effect unless terminated pursuant to Health and Safety Code §116330(c); and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED:

1. The Board of Supervisors acknowledges the benefit of maintaining a local small water system regulatory program in terms of providing local assistance to businesses and communities served by these water systems and to help minimize the number of agencies involved in regulating water systems.
2. The County of Nevada Board of Supervisors authorizes the Chair of the Board of Supervisors to execute the new Local Primacy Agency Delegation Agreement.
3. The County of Nevada Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of Environmental Health Department or his/her designee to implement the new Local Primacy Agency Delegation Agreement and execute any additional documents necessary to execute the program.
