SUBJECT: Resolution approving the execution of a renewal contract with Common Purpose in the amount of \$120,000 for the contract term of July 1, 2025, to June 30, 2026, to provide recovery housing services for Probation clients in their recovery from alcohol/drug dependency.

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt the Resolution.

<u>FUNDING</u>: This contract in the amount of \$120,000 for fiscal year 2025-2026, is 100% funded by State Local Community Corrections Account apportionment (AB109) funds. Funding is included in the FY 2025/26 budget and no budget amendment is needed. No general funds are required.

BACKGROUND:

AB 109 legislation requires each county to maintain its own Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) plan regarding use of sanctions and evidence-based practices to supervise, improve services and reduce recidivism. The 2025-2026 CCP budget allocates monies for the purposes of providing recovery housing to Probation clients in fiscal year 2025-2026.

The contract with Common Purpose for fiscal year 2025-2026, provides outpatient services and recovery housing in a family recovery environment where individuals are provided housing in a local residence and are required to participate in activities which develop self-sufficiency and decrease homelessness including performing house chores and maintenance responsibilities.

This contract supports the mission of Nevada County Probation in providing support for probationers' achievement of successful reintegration back into their families and communities.
