## OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NEVADA

RESOLUTION APPROVING NEVADA COUNTY'S MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES ACT (MHSA) INNOVATION (INN) FIVE-YEAR WORK PLAN DEVELOPING COLLABORATION TO STRENGTHEN THE CRISIS CONTINUUM OF CARE, ATTACHED HERE AS EXHIBITS A, B, AND C, FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017/18 THROUGH FISCAL YEAR 2021/22 AND AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH TO SIGN AND SUBMIT THE WORK PLAN

WHEREAS, the Mental Health Services Act (Proposition 63), adopted by the California electorate on November 2, 2004, created a new revenue source for the transformation and enhancement of public mental health services; and

WHEREAS, the goal of MHSA is to reduce the long-term impact on individuals/ families and the community from untreated serious mental illness; and

WHEREAS, the current components of the MHSA Plan are: Community Services and Support (CSS), Workforce Education and Training (WET), Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI), and Innovation (INN); and

WHEREAS, per Resolution 17-106 the Board of Supervisors approved the Nevada County MHSA Annual Plan Update to the Three-Year Program and Expenditure Plan for Fiscal Year 2016/17 and Annual Progress Report for Fiscal Year 2014/15; and

WHEREAS, an Innovation Plan was not submitted with the MHSA Three-Year Program and Expenditure Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Nevada County Behavioral Health Department desires to submit an MHSA Innovation Five-Year Work Plan *Developing Collaboration to Strengthen the Crisis Continuum of Care*, attached here as Exhibits A, B, and C, that will ultimately be integrated into the MHSA Three-Year Program and Expenditure Plan; and

WHEREAS, consistent with statutory requirements, the Draft Work Plan was posted for 30-day public review and comments, and a public hearing was held by the local mental health board or commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Nevada County Board of Supervisors of the County of Nevada, approves Nevada County's Mental Health Services Act Innovation Five-Year Work Plan *Developing Collaboration to Strengthen the Crisis Continuum of Care*, attached here as Exhibits A, B, and C, for Fiscal Year 2017/18 through Fiscal Year 2021/22, and authorizes the Behavioral Health Director to sign and submit the Work Plan.
