



RESOLUTION No. 17-122

OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NEVADA

RESOLUTION TO TERMINATE A PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY DUE TO EXTREME PRECIPITATION, EXCESSIVE WATER CAPTURE, SIGNIFICANT DAMAGE TO OROVILLE DAM SPILLWAYS AND MANDATORY EVACUATIONS IN COMMUNITIES BELOW THE OROVILLE DAM COMMENCING ON FEBRUARY 12, 2017

WHEREAS, on February 13, 2017, the Director of Emergency Services for the County of Nevada (“Director”) proclaimed the existence of a local emergency within Nevada County as a result of extreme precipitation, excessive water capture, significant damage to Oroville Dam spillways, mandatory evacuations in communities below the Oroville Dam (the “Oroville Dam Incident”) and its related impacts on Nevada County, commencing on February 12, 2017 (“Emergency Proclamation”); and

WHEREAS, on February 14, 2017, by Resolution 17-087, the Nevada County Board of Supervisors ratified and extended the Director’s Emergency Proclamation as required by law; and

WHEREAS, the situation resulting from said conditions of extreme peril is now deemed to be within the control of the normal protective services, personnel, equipment and facilities of the County of Nevada and the Director has recommended that the Board of Supervisors terminate the Emergency Proclamation related to the Oroville Dam Incident.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Nevada hereby terminates the Emergency Proclamation related to the Oroville Dam Incident.
