**SUBJECT:** Resolution approving acceptance of additional funding for Nevada County's Comprehensive Tobacco Control Plan through Contract Number: CTCP-21-29, increasing revenue funds from \$1,050,000, to \$1,650,000 (an increase of \$600,000) and extending the agreement termination date through June 30, 2027. (RES. 21-515)

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**RECOMMENDATION:** Approve the attached Resolution.

**FUNDING:** This is State discretionary funding generated from passage of Proposition 99 (The Tobacco Tax and Health Protection Act of 1988) and Proposition 56 (The Tobacco Tax Increase Initiative of 2016). Each of California's 58 counties and 3 City Health Departments are designated Local Lead Agencies (LLA). As the lead tobacco control agency at the community level, the Public Health Department is responsible for coordinating information, referral, outreach, and educational activities within its respective health jurisdiction.

Nevada County's allocation is as follows: Fiscal Year (FY) 2021/22- \$150,000; FY 2022/23- \$300,000; FY 2023/24- \$300,000; FY 2024/25 - \$300,000; FY25/26 - \$300,000; and FY26/27 - \$300,000. Funding was anticipated and included in the Department's FY 2025-26 budget and there are no county general fund dollars required in the plan.

**BACKGROUND:** California's Tobacco Control Program was developed in response to passage by California voters of Proposition 99, the Tobacco Tax and Health Protection Act of 1988. These funds are combined with Proposition 56 funds, the Tobacco Tax Increase Initiative of 2016, which allows for an expanded allocation to counties to support tobacco use prevention programs. The California Department of Public Health-Tobacco Control Section administers a portion of these funds to Local Lead Agencies, including the Nevada County Public Health Department. As a condition of funding, Local Lead Agencies are required to submit Comprehensive Tobacco Plans as required and pursuant to Health and Safety Code, Section 104350-104480 and Section 104500-

104545.

On December 14, 2021, per Resolution 21-515, the Nevada County Board of Supervisors approved execution of the Comprehensive Tobacco Control Plan, approved by the state for the contract term of January 1, 2022 through June 30, 2025.

It is requested that the Board approve the amended funding allocation to the Nevada County Comprehensive Tobacco Control Plan for the period through June 30, 2027 as it enables Nevada County to continue to provide important tobacco prevention and education services for its residents and allows continuation of State funding for the County's Tobacco Use Prevention Program. The previously approved Plan provided funding for the usual three-year funding period for the Comprehensive Tobacco Control Plan; however, the state has opted to extend the current period of the Plan by two years instead starting a new three-year Plan.
