SUBJECT: Resolution approving execution of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Nevada County Health and Human Services Agency, Nevada County Probation Department ("Probation"), Nevada County Department of Public Health, Nevada County Social Services, Nevada County Behavioral Health, Nevada County Superintendent of Schools, and Alta California Regional Center related to developing a coordinated approach to serving children and families receiving interagency services.

BACKGROUND: This is a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Nevada County Health and Human Services Agency, Nevada County Probation Department ("Probation"), Nevada County Department of Public Health, Nevada County Social Services, Nevada County Behavioral Health, Nevada County Superintendent of Schools, and Alta California Regional Center. The MOU pursuant to Assembly Bill 2083, addresses systemic barriers to the traditional provision of interagency services, and promotes, develops, and implements a Children's System of Care setting forth the roles and responsibilities of agencies and other entities that serve children and youth in foster care who have experienced severe trauma. Agency partners seek to ensure that all public programs for children, youth and families provide services in an integrated, comprehensive, culturally responsive, trauma informed, evidence-based/best practice manner, regardless of the agency by which children and families enter. The MOU promotes coordinated data collection and exchanges between partners to minimize delays or barriers to excellent service provision.

It is the intent of this MOU to create and maintain an administrative team with collaborative authority over the child welfare, juvenile justice, education, children's health and mental health services to enhance the operations of their activities, decisions, and direction of each of their employees regarding children, youth, and family services.

It is recommended that the Board approve this Memorandum of Understanding to ensure an integrated continuum of interagency services for children and families.
