RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING JULY 19th THROUGH 25TH, 2026, AS PROBATION SERVICES WEEK

WHEREAS, Probation Departments are the key connector in the justice system, and our communities, working to maximize the resources available within the courts, local governments, law enforcement, social services, behavioral health systems, schools, crime survivor organizations, and non-profits; and

WHEREAS, Probation officers in California are diverse, educated, and highly skilled and trained professionals dedicated to serving their communities; and

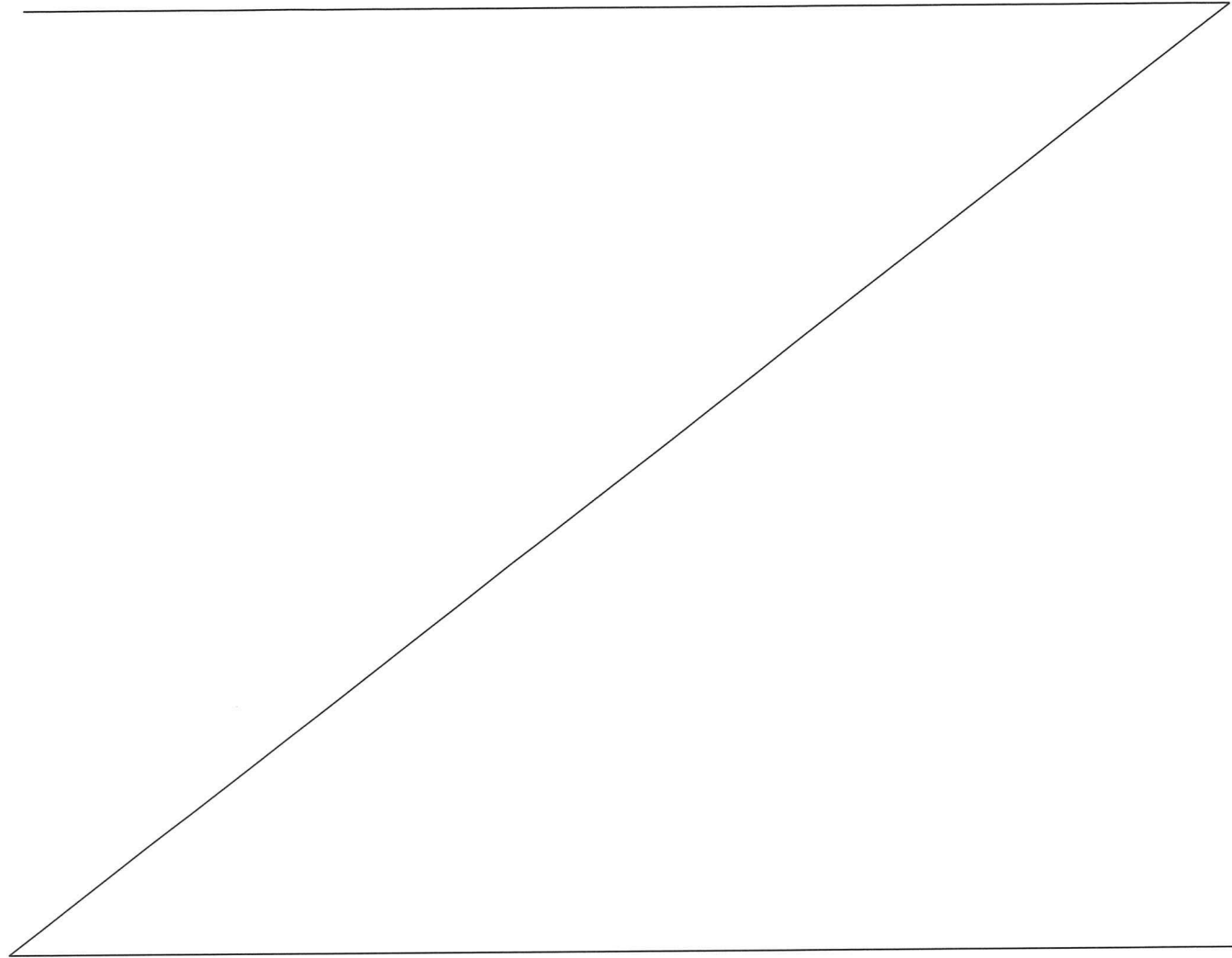
