General Plan Guiding Principles

- Minimize the negative impacts of transportation infrastructure upon Truckee's community character, local neighborhoods, and the environment.
- Work cooperatively with adjacent jurisdictions to address regional traffic issues.
- Reduce automobile travel demand to reduce impacts on the Town's roadway system, lessen the need for new or expanded road facilities to accommodate increased demand, and decrease pollutants emissions from automobiles.
- Provide a safe, comprehensive, and integrated system of trails and bikeways as a key component of the circulation system.
- Promote a safe and efficient transit system, including both bus and rail, to reduce congestion, improve the environment, and provide viable alternatives to the automobile.

- Additional Alternative Transportation Option
- Enhance Economic Vitality and Quality of Life ©



Procurement Process and Vendor Selection

- Eight (8) Proposals Received
 - Five (5) Dockless
 - Two (2) with Docking Stations
 - One Non-Responsive
- Eight (8) Person Evaluation Committee
- Unanimous Decision on Docking Station Business
 Model with BCycle as Most Qualified Vendor



Typical Operating Models

- Most Common
 - Privately owned and operated (under contract with municipality)
- Other Models
 - Publicly owned and privately or nonprofit operated
 - Nonprofit owned and operated
 - Hybrid



Key Elements of RFP


Solicit RFP with the Following Tasks:

- Bikeshare Program Planning
- Bikeshare Charging Site and Network Design
- Proven Program implementation
- Maintenance and Asset redistribution Plan
- Pricing and Security of Financial Transactions
- Marketing and outreach experience, including engagement of local bike shops and proven experience with equity programs






Docking Station Siting Considerations

- Adjacent Land Use/Activity Centers






Preliminary Site Identification

2023 Launch Tasks

- Finalize Agreement with Vendor
- Overcome Supply Issues and Receive Remaining Bikes
- Work with Vendor on Partnerships (Branding, Program Management, Regional Opportunities
- Develop Pre-launch Marketing Campaign and Ongoing Outreach Plan
- Set up Monitoring and Evaluation Program



2023 Launch Tasks

Phase 1 - Town Controlled Property and Rightof-Way

- Permitted via 2 Party Agreement between Town and BCycle
- Early Summer 2023

Phase 2 – Public Agency Facilities Locations

- Allowable under current Public Facilities Zoning and Authorized via 2 Party Agreement between Agency and BCycle
- Mid Summer 2023

Phase 3 – Private Commercial

- Summer 2024
- Requires Amendment to Development Code



How Do We Measure Success

- System Utilization
 - # of Rides
 - # of Users
 - Trip Length and Duration
 - Time of day
 - Trips per device per day
 - Station Utilization
- Rider Characteristics
 - Demographics
 - Trip Purpose (work, rec, etc.)

- Customer Experience
 - bikes and stations availability
 - Complaints and Service Calls
 - Responsiveness of Clutter Abatement and Rebalancing
